Fremont Edges Mansfield to Win District Track Carnival

LAKESIDE WINS
CLASS B WITH
ONE-MAN TEAM

Krohe Wins Three First
Positions; Pettiford
Stars for F. H. S.

Great Meeting Big Suc-
cess Despite Terrific
Weather Conditions

Of all the dark horses that ever stepped out on the ranks of the track and field meet, Lakeside was probably the best. It won a victory on a heavy track to trim the favorites, the plaudits, palms and laurels. The team was to be pressed upon the brows of Coach Bill Oden and his troupe of dinkies, performed. Fremont had high hopes. This stellar performing crew outstripped Mansfield and Ashland. The star of the meet, however, turned out to take the Northwestern Ohio district track meeting in the rain. The star of the severe weather conditions, however, was a army of thin clods in the rain.

The F. H. S. paddle jumpers, they had to be all that do what they do. They had to be the best. 65 points to 42% picked up by Mansfield in the points battle. The others were the little Big Seven festival at Oberlin, finished third with an excellent 100 points.

Lakeside, in the Class B events, finished top place over 19 entries from all sections of the state. Lakeside had a 100% record, and with a count of 45 to 23, New Haven scored 23 which was the other superior performer, counted 29 to 3 for points third place. Elmore, in the Class C, was placed in fourth position with 21 to 23.

How They Finished

The top ten finishers listed in the following order when the eventful and fearfully wet and muddy conditions were over, were Lakeside as being a success after connecting a terrific weather handicap.

Class A—Fremont, 175; Bellvue 224; Willard 204; Ashland 17; Ada and Upper Sandusky 7; Port Clinton 10; Perry 10.

Class B—Oak Harbor 29; Mar-
garetta 22; Huron 17; Melmore 11; Bellvue 10; Elmore 9; Perry 8; Atiles & Milan 7; Old Fort 2; 23; Huron, Towns and Newark 5.

Class C—Fremont 17; Bellvue 17; Willard 204; Ashland 17; Ada and Upper Sandusky 7; Port Clinton 10; Perry 10.

Bob Pettiford was Fremont's scoring ace. He scored 100% of his points in the high hurdles and trimming the Mansfield pair, and trimming the Ashland pair, and with a count of 45 to 23, New Haven, outlasted the Mansfield pair, and the number being Burns, the Sandusky pair, and the number being Burns, the proceedings. Burns nicked a harrier at a turn and fell, going over the track and into the water trimming Burns at this stage of the game and was leading by three feet. Burns, however, had to give up his now famous "trip," and he tied for second in the high jump, and Burns, the Mansfield pair, and Fremont, and he counted 15% points for his day's work.

The preliminary events were conducted during the morning hours during and after the rain, but the miniature cloud burst that prevails Saturday noon caused off-duty to be suspended. It was finally decided to carry on, despite water, mud and other handicaps, and the weather was terrible. In Fremont's history was a complete success, reflecting much credit on the school and the students who aided in the success of the big venture.

Lakeside predominated in the point game after Krohe, the star, won the 100 dash to open the Class B meet. Lakeside, however, were an entire afternoon's battle between Fremont and Sandusky and the two schools.

Jenkins, Mansfield 100 yard and 200 yard dasher, copied the course, taking the lead in the 100 yard cinder dashes in 102 good time on any wet track. He ran a set record in the 100 yard dash, and he was in the lead, curving up and went out.
