In other volleyball matches, Clyde suffered double setbacks at Eastwood as both the varsity and the reserve teams lost.

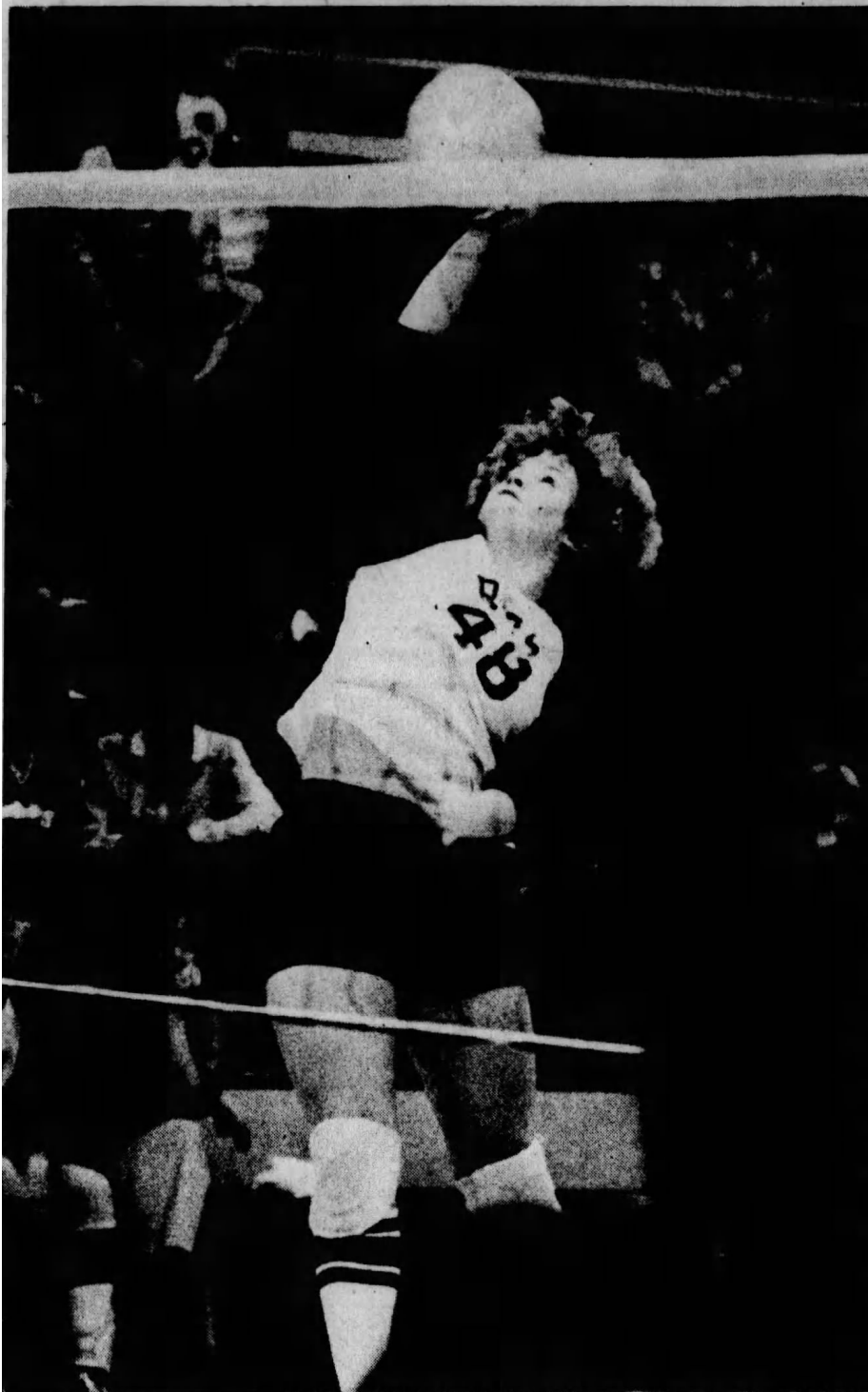

The Clyde JVs raised their record to 13-1 with 15-8 and 15-7 game wins. LuAnn Leffler had 14 for the Flierettes.

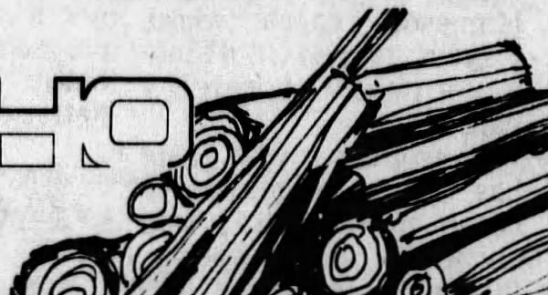
