# Ross Golfers Finish Second In Buckeye Link Tourney

## Three-Team Race Forms In SBC Meet

CASTALIA — Sandusky Bay Conference track meet took on the appearance of a triangular affair during the Monday preliminaries. Margaretta, Clyde and Lakota were clustered at the top in the number of qualifiers for tonight's finals of the five-team meet.

Margaretta had ten men qualify for finals as preliminaries were run in 120-yard high hurdles, 100-yard dash, 440-yard dash, 220-yard dash, 180-yard low hurdles. Clyde finished the day with nine qualifiers, Lakota had seven, Oak Harbor two and Gibsonburg none.

Clyde Coach J. D. Milburn anticipates a tight battle in the field events against the first day leaders of the meet. The prowess of senior Mel Miller is expected to be felt in three events for Margaretta. Miller has a good chance to take three firsts in pole vault, shot put and high jump.

At the same time Clyde has a good chance of scoring heavy these same three field events. Milburn is also hopeful his runners can make their presence felt in both relays, 100, 220 and 440-yard dashes. He sees a chance for a place in each of the hurdles events.

Fastest time in the high hurdle qualifier Monday was a :17.4 by Clyde's Smart. Clyde runners won both heats of the 100-yard dash and 440. Lakota swept the firsts in the two 220-yard qualifiers.

# Nature Trails Is Rugged Venture For Wild-Swatter

BETTSVILLE — They tell a story down this way about a golfer on one of the tight, wood-guarded fairways at Nature Trails golf course. When the golfer hooked his ball into the woods he heard a loud "Pssst!"

He looked up and a red fox sitting on a tree stump said, "You had your club face closed." The blue bird sitting on the fox's shoulder debated, "You're nuts, he rolled his wrists!"

There may be some doubt about the veracity of this story, but there is no doubt about the closeness to nature when you play Nature Trails Golf Course.

The old timers in the Bettsville area knew this 80 acres of woods as Int Woods, a favorite

At the present there are three leagues that call Nature Trails home. ## Findlay Posts Repeat Crown In Walkaway

MANSFIELD—Findlay linksmen ran away with a 20-stroke win in the Buckeye Conference golf tournament Monday on Westbrook Country Club course, but Fremont Ross pulled a surprise by finishing second. Coach Dick Sherman's golfers won a three-way dog fight for second place over the tight Westbrook course.

Bill Wingard and Bob Horner fired rounds of 83 to set the pace for the Ross team. They were aided by Ken Hilty's 88 and an 89 by Jay Waggoner.

The steady Ross showing nipped Marion by three strokes, 343-346. Sandusky was a close fourth, one stroke behind Marion.

Defending champion Findlay made it strictly no contest for the championship with a 323 total and 20 stroke margin. Evidence of the battle for second was seen in the fact the spread between the top two teams was three strokes greater than the spread between second and sixth.

Defending Medalist Tom Norris was bested by teammate Mike Strathman for this year's medalist honors. Strathman was the only golfer in the field to break 80 with a two-over-par 74. He shot identical rounds of 37-37 for the leading total. Norris with an 81 was also topped by another Findlay golfer, Scott Hugas, who shot an 80.

Wingard and Horner had the fifth lowest individual scores posted in the tournament.
