A.K. is first Ross foe

If the weatherman cooperates, Fremont Ross' baseball team may get its season opener under its belt Saturday. The Little Giants are slated to host the Admiral King Admiral King Admiral s in a doubleheader (10 a.m. and 2 p.m.) at Fremont's Anderson Field.

Ed Platzer, the third new head coach in as many years for Ross, will lead a "green" Ross team into a 25-game season. The Bowling Green grad, who was an All-Mid-American outfield selection in 1971, has only three lettermen on his 23-man squad.

There are 10 seniors and 13 juniors with only seniors Mark Lohrbach and Al Beard having had enough experience to letter last season. Junior Mike McGilton, a starter at catcher for the last half of his sophomore year, is the third Ross letter winner.

"Hopefully," Platzer said when asked about his team's strong point, "is its speed. I feel we will have a good running club."

He switched to weaknesses after that and pointed out the lack of experience.

"Our pitching right now would have to be questionable, too," Platzer said.

Lohrbach, when he is not playing at shortstop will most likely take over the top pitching slot for the Little Giants. "He throws the ball pretty well," his coach said, and noted that

Lohrbach would start one of Saturday's games.

Beard is the number two Ross pitcher with junior John Kiser drawing assignments also.

At second will be either Belch or senior Dennis Szymanowski. Lohrbach will be at short but when he is pitching, Belch will handle that spot with Szymanowski at second.

Whitcomb or Jerry Ruland, a junior will be sharing the hot corner assignment while out in leftfield, a pair of juniors, Roger Berger and Kiser, will split the action.

The centerfield slot will go to Jim Paxson, a senior with another senior, Jeff Foss, in rightfield.

"McGilton has a lot of potential to be one of our better hitters," Platzer contended.

Aiding Platzer in his first year at the helm of the Little Giant diamond squad is Hank Miesle and both coaches agree on one point about this year's team.

"The attitude has been good . . . we have only been able to get on the field twice so far but the players are anxious and are working hard toward the start of the season."

After the Saturday debut, Ross will travel to Port Clinton on Monday and to Elyria on Saturday, April 12. The second home appearance is scheduled against Tiffin Columbian on April 15.

Half-inch separates leader from second

DAYTON, Ohio (AP) — A bit of carelessness cost Carl Alsip, of Cincinnati, Ohio, first place in regular singles in the American Bowling Congress tournament Thursday.

Alsip, 32, is now in second.

It all happened in the ninth frame of his third game after he had already posted games of 233 and 258.
