



Ross Swimmers Face Sandusky

State swimming title contenders in 1958, Fremont Ross and Sandusky clash at 7:30 tonight in the Sandusky high natatorium in a dual meet.

Ross finished seventh in the state and Sandusky fifth. Fremont tankers who placed in the state meet and are back again this season are Tom Trout, junior, who won the fancy diving championship, Jim Streeter, senior and Jack Talbot, junior who both picked up sixth places.

Veteran Mentor

Veteran Coach Walter Caldwell of Sandusky has three veterans back including William Gill, butterfly and individual medley participant; Mike Bennett, sprint and free style performer; and Dave Frohman, who may give Trout some stiff competition in the diving event. Caldwell lost some depth off last year's team, seven seniors graduating, but he has some good prospects on the returnee list.

Trout, Streeter, Talbot, Gordon Tod, John Myers, Mike Cochran, Bob Vogel, Dick Gwinup, John Roush and John Schaaf provide the experience for Ross Coaches Bill Faunce and Don Kepler. Some new boys will add depth to the squad.

Split Even

Last year, the teams split even in two dual meets. Ross beat Sandusky early in the season 52-34 at Fremont and Sandusky turned around later to top Ross by 46-40 at Sandusky. Coach Caldwell did some position changing in the second meeting that had a telling effect.

Jim Streeter, Talbot Set New Standards

Fremont Ross and Sandusky battled all the way to the final race before the Little Giant swimming team emerged a winner by 45 to 41 in the Sandusky high natatorium Wednesday.

Final relay race, won by Fremont, decided the meet. Ross high 200-yard relay team of Dick Gwinup, John Myers, John Schaaf and Gordon Tod provided seven points to erase Sandusky's 41-38 edge.

Two new pool records were set, both by Fremont. Junior Jack Talbot broke his own Sandusky pool record in the 100-yard backstroke with a time of 1:04.9. Previous record of 1:05.9 was set by Talbot in the Sandusky pool last year.

Jim Streeter, a senior, set a pool record in the 150-yard individual medley with the time of 1:43.4. Previous mark was 1:43.6.

Ross was without the services of Junior Tom Trout, state fancy diving champion. Trout missed the meet due to an infected foot but should be ready to go by the time of Ross high's next meet, against the Marion 'Y' team on January 8 in the Fremont Junior high school natatorium.

Co-Coaches Don Kepler and Bill Faunce said the Ross team looked good overall but more depth is needed in certain events. They predicted that if the squad keeps working and improving it should make up the deficit by the time the state meet rolls around.

Mike Bennett, William Gill, Dave Frohman and the relay medley team won first places for Sandusky.

Streeter took two firsts, Talbot one, Tod one, Mike Cochran one and the relay team one for Ross high.

New Pool Mark Set By Marion

Unbeaten Fremont At Columbus Next

Swimming team of Ross high school takes an unbeaten record into a triangular meet at Columbus Saturday where Ross, Sandusky and Columbus Academy compete in the Academy pool starting at 2 p.m.

Ross won its second dual meet of the season Thursday by topping the Marion 'Y' team 52-34 in the Fremont Junior high school natatorium. Fremont previously defeated Sandusky and tied Oberlin College Jayvees.

New Record

One new pool record was set last night, Marion's Cooper swimming the 150-yard individual medley at 1:39.9. He and Fremont's Jack Talbot finished almost neck and neck, Talbot doing the distance in 1:40.

Old pool record was 1:42.8 set by J. Van Horn of Canton McKinley in 1954. Actually, Talbot topped the Fremont school record in distance but didn't place first so it will not be recognized. Jim Streeter, present Varsity member, set the Ross school record with a time of 1:42.1 in the state meet at Columbus last year.

First places for Fremont were taken by John Schaaf in the 50-yard free style, 26.5 seconds; Gordon Tod in the 100-yard free style, 56.8 seconds; Lynn Huffman in the 100-yard breast stroke; and the 200-yard relay medley team and the 200-yard relay team.

Coaches Bill Faunce and Don Kepler were encouraged by the performances of youngsters Bill Wensinger, junior who was swimming in his first competitive meet; Mike Cochran and Lynn Huffman, Wensinger doing well in the 200 free style and free style relay, Cochran in the 100 butterfly and Huffman in the 100 orthodox.

Five Lima Pool Records Fall As Ross Loses First Swimming Meet Of Season

Talbot, Tod Set Marks; Lima Boy, Relay Team Also

First season loss suffered by the Fremont Ross swimming team was a "toughie," the Purple and White tankers falling by only two points, 44-42 to Lima Senior high at Lima Thursday, despite setting three new pool records.

Ross has previously won three straight dual meets. The Little Giant splashers try for No. 4 Saturday afternoon at Findlay, first event at 1:30 o'clock.

Co-Coaches Bill Faunce and Don Kepler said the meet was a "good one" and that Lima had a fine team. "We had a couple of bad breaks and they were the difference between winning and losing," the coaches agreed.

Jack Talbot, splendid junior

swimmer from Ross, continued his assault on pool records, setting two in the Lima pool. Gordon Tod also set one new Lima pool standard.

Talbot won the 120-yard individual medley in the time of 1:19.5 for a new record in that event in the Lima pool.

Talbot also had a new Lima pool record time of 1:06.3 in the 100 backstroke.

Tod, a Ross senior, went 58 seconds in the 100 free style for a new Lima pool record.

Lima also set two new pool records, Charles Hunter winning in record time in the 200 free style in 2:06 and the Lima medley relay team winning in record time, 1:34.7 in the 160-yard event.

Ross fell behind right from the start and could never quite catch the Lima swimmers. First victory for Fremont was by Talbot in the 100 backstroke to pull Ross to win

within eight points, 14-22, after four events. Gordon Tod then came through for the Little Giants event, as Lima's lead was cut to 25-20. However, Lima won the next event, the 100 breaststroke.

Tom Trout won the diving event and Jim Kaufman placed second to pull Fremont to within five points, 29-34. Talbot came up with his pool record in the individual medley and Jim Streeter captured one point with a third to leave Ross trailing 35-37 prior to the final events on the program, the relay races. Ross had to win both to win the meet.

Ross Swimmers Host WRA

Secret Of 'Lonesome End' Disclosed

NEW YORK (AP) — Col. Earl (Red) Blaik, most prolific and successful in Army's line of football coaches, at last has made public the secret of the "lonesome end."

Blaik broke a four month silence on the method devised to give end Bill Carpenter — who never went near an offensive huddle — the offensive play when he was honored by the Touchdown Club Thursday night.

"You noticed that Caldwell (quarterback Joe Caldwell) would stand facing the huddle sometimes with his left foot forward a bit," Blaik said.

"Well, that meant a run. If the right foot was forward, there was going to be a pass. If his feet were together there would also be a run.

"Now Carpenter had to take various cuts with each play and

he would return the foot signal with a signal of his own to tell Caldwell which way he would go. The cut would be the same for a running or a pass play. His signal would be some motion, such as touching his helmet, tugging at his pants, or the like.

"Now wasn't that simple?" he asked as everyone looked at each other wondering whether it was as simple as Blaik described.

But Blaik steadfastly held to another cherished secret, that of his successor at West Point when his resignation becomes effective Feb. 15. Blaik announced his retirement as Army football coach last week after 17 years at the point.

Blaik received the Touchdown Club award for his 25 years as a head coach, eight of which were spent at Dartmouth before he took over at Army in 1941.



We have a happy position behind the plate. Elston Howard developed rapidly last year. Yogi Berra is far from through and will see plenty of service behind the plate, possibly at first base and in the outfield. Young Johnny Blanchard appears ready to stick with the team as a utility catcher.

I hope to give the Yankee fans another championship club in 1959.
