FIFTEEN TEAMS IN CROSS-COUNTRY RUN

DELAWARE, O., Oct. 31.—UP—Fifteen schools, headed by Springfield, the defending champion, have entered runners in the annual state high school cross-country meet at Ohio Wesleyan tomorrow.

Besides Springfield, the following schools have entered competitors: Akron North, Akron South, Cleveland West, Cleveland Collinwood, Cleveland Rhodes, Fremont, Mansfield, Lakewood, Toledo Libbey, Cincinnati Hughes, Cincinnati Walnut Hills, Enon, Circleville and Marble Furnace.

ROSS RUNNERS FINISH LAST

**Cold Weather And Mud
Hampers Harriers In
State Meet Saturday**

Blame it on the chill weather or a half-mile of three-inch mud. The Ross high scanty-clads were from one to two minutes slower than usual at Delaware Saturday and finished last among the 11 teams seeking the state cross-country title.

The run was won by Akron North with a low score of 49, followed by Lakewood, 73; Akron East, 87; Akron South, 112 and Toledo Libbey, 129 points. Don Rydgig of the winners was first across the finish line in 10:17.1, with Warren Schoonover of Libbey, second.

Ed Davisson was the first Little Giant to finish, coming in 38th in 11:40. The other Fremont runners finished as follows: Bill Berger, 40th; Don Druckenmiller, 43rd; Norm Feighner, 83rd; Bob Schlea, 85th; Jack Williamson, 86th and Irv Abney, 87th.

It was the final run of the season for the Purple harriers who placed second in the district meet and scored a victory over Toledo Woodward while losing to Toledo Waite and Mansfield in dual meets.
