Ross girls swim to pair of TRAC race titles

Sammi Miller was crowned Three Rivers Athletic Conference champion in the 100 freestyle (54.79) and Laura Duncan was champion in the 100 butterfly (1:01.52) as the Ross girls finished third (435 points) at Saturday's TRAC Championships at St. Francis de Sales.

Both swam the middle legs of the winning 200 medley relay (1:52.62) with Haley Fisher and Megan Hawk. The same four won the 200 free relay (1:41.24). Miller was second in the 50 free, while Fisher was second in the 200 individual medley and Duncan was runner-up in the 100 breaststroke.

St. Ursula won the girls title with 577.5 points, while Notre Dame Academy took second (473).

Graham Moor took fifth in 200 IM and Keith Wasserman was fifth in the 100 free, both were also part of the fourth-place 200 free relay with Bobby Carnicom and Christopher Hoffman. The Ross boys finished fourth (332 points). Wasserman, Carnicom, Hoffman and Scott Kosakowski were fifth in the 400 free relay. Brett Foos was fifth at 1-meter diving.

St. Francis took first with 827 points, Findlay was second at 451 and St. John's Jesuit was third at 384.
