

Elyria is BC mat champ

SANDUSKY — Elyria won its 16th Buckeye Conference Wrestling Tournament here Saturday, outscoring away

from the other five schools. With Elyria handily in command heading into the finals, it was a dogfight for second between Lorain, host Sandusky, Fremont Ross and Marion Harding. In the end, Sandusky salvaged the runnerup spot, being outpointed by Elyria 167½ to 120½.

Finishing third was Marion Harding with 116½, Lorain, with two falls in the last two matches, took fourth with 114 and Ross was fifth at 109½. Findlay settled for the basement with 58½.

"I told the kids before we came in here," Ross Coach Al Voggenthaler said, "that we could finish either second or fifth. As it was it went right on through before it was settled (second place)."

Lorain's defending champs — 185-pound Vince Villanucci and heavyweight Gary Huff — dumped Ross into the fifth spot. Villanucci pinned Ross's Mike Wendt in the championship finale in 56 seconds and Huff flattened Ross's Tony Gardner

in 1:50 of the final match of the tournament.

Rick Heidelberg was Ross's only champion out of the four Little Giants in the championship finals. He had two falls and a 7-5 decision over Greg Felton of Elyria in the 138-pound division.

The Ross junior was credited with a last second reversal against Felton to win the match. He had surrendered a 5-0 lead after a takedown and a three-point nearfall in the first period. Felton tied the match at 5-5 with a reversal and a penalty point on Heidelberg with 22 seconds remaining in the match.

"Yeah," he admitted, "I was getting tired. He was not as strong as I thought he would be, though."

"It was good getting the Heidelberg name back up there."

The latter referred to his brother, Jesse, a two-time BC champ at 105 in 1976 and 1977.

Ross pulled in runnerup slots at 126, 135 and heavyweight. Corey Beard lost to Elyria's Jim Harju, who won the crown at 119 in 1981, 7-1 in the finals.

Taking third for Ross were Mark Schmidt at 119, Craig Trick at 135, and Reggie Parks at 145. Schmidt defeated

Eldemar Cabotage 8-6 in his consolation finals match while Trick nipped Sam Ayish of Elyria 4-3 in his third place battle.

Parks defeated Mike Repko 6-0 in overtime for his third spot. The score was deadlocked 8-8 at the end of regulation.

Taking fourth for the Little Giants were Jeff Weikert at 98 and Mitch Cirliss at 167. Cirliss lost in overtime 6-4 to Pat Costello of Lorain in his consolation finals skirmish.

Huff was named the tournament's most valuable wrestler. The two-time conference champ registered three first period falls to easily winning the individual title.

The conference champs at the weight classes were Brad Parmer, 98, of Harding; Neil McCarty, 105, Sandusky, two-time champ; Darrin Farrow, 112, Elyria; Kevin Pierson, 119, Elyria; Harju, 126; Robert Smith, 132, Elyria;

Heidelberg, 138; Joe Heater, 145; Findlay; Charles Jones, 155, Sandusky, a three-time conference champion; King Mayse, 167, Harding; Bill Curly, 175, Sandusky, two-time champ; Villanucci, 185, and Huff, heavyweight, both repeat champs.
