## Little Giants have experience, new additions

Ross finished 12-11 last year for its first winning season since 2005.

“What helped last year and what every team wants is chemistry,” Little Giants coach Juan Vela said. “Any of our girls is a threat to shoot or drive – it will be fun to see who steps up to make plays.

“They enjoy playing together.”

Senior starters Ahlia Simms and Jazmin Bulger led the team in scoring last season and junior Marissa Overmyer is also back. Seniors Braelyn Horn and Breyari Nason have varsity experience and junior Jasannah Sabiers is in the mix.

“They’re used to the emotion of the game and that rubs off on the younger girls,” Vela said. “We have some skill. It’s always exciting to put the pieces of the puzzle together.”

Vela has three new pieces in Bellevue junior transfers Olivia Baptista and Rachel Gore and freshman Brooklyn Baptista.

“They love the game,” Vela said. “They’ve worked at it. Their attitude is great. It’s nice to have girls who love to play who are unselfish.”

The girls feel welcome.

“I’m excited to play for Coach Vela,” she said. “He’s really helped with the transition for not only me, but my sister as well. The team has also been a huge part.

“Our teammates have made us feel comfortable. The season will be exciting because we all made one goal as a team and want to do it all for each other.”

# Fremont Ross dominates Clyde in season opener

FREMONT - Jazmin Bulger of Fremont Ross could have held the ball for the final shot as time wound down in the second quarter Friday.

The senior point guard instead opted for a 3-pointer with 13 seconds left and the Little Giants had their biggest lead to that point in a 62-38 victory over Clyde to open the season. Ross canned its first eight shots in the third quarter.

"That brought us some momentum to the second half," said Bulger, who scored a game-high 17 points.

"I didn't think I was going to make it, so I was glad when it went in. I feel like we are going to be a second-half team."

Heidi Marshall and Jacqueline Smith scored out of the half for the Fliers, but a 3 by Olivia Baptista pushed Ross's lead to 35-23. Later, leading 37-28, Bulger scored before Jasannah Sabiers dropped a bucket in off a bounce pass from Braelyn Horn.

"The unselfishness from the team

(stood out)," Little Giants coach Juan Vela said. "There was a lot of moments where a player had a good shot and gave it up for even a better shot. That's just the kind of team we have."

Bulger canned her third 3-pointer to open the fourth quarter. Ahlia Simms' bucket a minute later pushed the lead to 51-28.

Marissa Overmyer added one of nine 3-pointers for Ross.

"When this team hits shots, it gets the juice flowing," Vela said. "When Jazmin does that, the whole team is happy and it gets the energy going. In the first half, we had spurts where we weren't scoring."

Meanwhile, Clyde's offense struggled most of the night. Only Marshall, Smith and Alayna Barrera scored until a steal and layup by Haley Salazar with nine seconds left. The Fliers made just 11-of-40 shots (27.5 percent) on the night.

"It was a thumping," Clyde coach Dave Lozier said. "It was the first game and they could not miss and we could not hit a shot to save our life. They are

more athletic and a better basketball team than us right now."

After Clyde scored the first point, Baptista and younger sister, Brooklyn Baptista, made 3s for a lead the Little Giants never relinquished. Freshman Brooklyn Baptista had eight assists.

The Fliers fought back and tied the game at 13-13, but Simms scored before Olivia Baptista and Overmyer each hit 3s to force Lozier into a timeout. Marshall had 15 points, Smith 11 and Barrera 10.

"We stood around and watched people dribble," Lozier said. "It's frustrating in our part. It's the first game and we will turn the page. I would be more concerned if it was the last game."

Simms finished with a double-double of 12 points and 10 rebounds while Olivia Baptista had 11 points and eight rebounds in her first game at Ross. She played her first two seasons at Bellevue.

"There were nerves early on," Baptista said.

"I took it as a battle. I am very comfortable here. We all gelled well over the summer."

Jazmin Bulger split two free throws Monday to cut Fremont Ross' deficit to four points entering the fourth quarter.

Visiting Toledo Central Catholic, however, scored the next 15 points in a 61-44 victory in the Three Rivers Athletic Conference.

The Little Giants topped Clyde, Perkins and St. Ursula to start the season. The Fighting Irish provided a lesson in finishing.

"We'll have another game with our backs against the wall," Ross coach Juan Vela said. "Every team needs to learn to win. We can build on this."

The Little Giants visit Findlay on Thursday.

Central Catholic repeatedly capitalized on second-chance opportunities on offense.

"A big key for us is to rebound," Vela said. "It's whether they want to do it or not. This group wants to. They just had a bad day. Central Catholic played harder. We weren't shooting the ball well."

Bulger finished with 19 points. She drew several fouls off the dribble, but struggled from the line.

"She continues to attack and try to put her team on her shoulders," Vela said. "She's a high-energy competitor. I know what I'll get. We have to find other ways to win."

Freshman Brooklyn Baptista added 12 points for Ross. Olivia Baptista kicked off a 10-0 run with a pass to Bulger and capped it with a 3-pointer as Monday's game was tied 22-22 at the half.

"When you have an athlete who loves it and has a passion for the game, it's always a positive," Vela said of the addi-

# Baptista takes aim at Ross shooting records

Olivia Baptista of Fremont Ross missed a couple 3-pointers in the fourth quarter and went to the bench in a victory over St. Ursula last week.

One made 3 shy of the program record, Baptista's teammates urged her to sit next to Little Giants coach Juan Vela.

"He put me back in," Baptista said of dropping in 3 number seven to set the mark. "Everybody was into it. The girls got me the ball. Coach was into it after it happened."

Baptista made at least one 3 in every quarter, including three in the fourth.

"It was not a surprise," Vela said. "The coaches talked about her breaking the record. I also can see her sister breaking it. She was confident from the first shot in the first game like she's been here for years.

"She doesn't hold back. She fit in right away. She's one of the hardest workers I've had. She's obsessed with the game. They just have a knack for shooting."

Baptista played varsity for Bellevue as a sophomore last season before coming to Ross with her father, Ed Baptista, who is the Little Giants' offensive coordinator for football. Freshman Brooklyn Baptista and junior Rachel Gore also joined Vela's program.

"Two shooters stretch the floor," Vela said. "Their skill sets would make any team better. The best part is how they get along with everybody. Their teammates are important to them and they know it takes a team to make it work."

"It's not about them, it's about us." Brooklyn averages 11 points and 2.5 assists, while Olivia averages 10 points and four rebounds.

“Her basketball IQ,” Vela said of Olivia. “She’s one of the players I love having on the court. She knows what needs to happen to succeed. Bringing the ball up, getting a rebound or putting it in another player’s hands.

“She’s one of our better defenders with her angles.”

Ross is 13-6, including five losses in the Three Rivers Ath-

letic Conference. Senior Jazmin Bulger leads the team at 16.8 points and six rebounds per game.

“What impresses me most is her consistency throughout the season,” Vela said. “She’s been at a high level almost every game. Last year she could drive and rebound, but she’s better handling the ball and shooting.

“She’s one of our better defenders at guard. When a player does that all game, it’s hard to take her out.”

Baptista was encouraged to shoot from the time she arrived.

Vela loves what he’s seen the last two weeks.

“She had a green light, but she was hesitant,” he said. “I told her to let it fly and she’s bought in. She was trying to figure things out. It wasn’t how fast, but how comfortable she was. The last four or five games she’s just playing.”

Baptista knows shooting is an important part of her role in the offense, but it’s not her focus.

“I don’t pay much attention to scoring as long as everyone is on the same page,” she said. “From the beginning, we fit in and the

girls welcomed us. Coach told me to be a little more selfish and shoot more.”

Her teammates obviously can’t get enough either.

“Not as far as talking, but their actions in practice and how they treat people,” Vela said. “Their leadership has been big and they make it fun. Whenever it’s fun, they get better.”

## Bulger helps Ross take step up

Fremont Ross coach Juan Vela gave his girls a history lesson last season and reminded them it had been quite a while since the Little Giants reached certain benchmarks.

Ross senior Jazmin Bulger heard her coach loud and clear. Bulger was recognized first-team all-Northwest District and Three Rivers Athletic Conference.

The Little Giants (15-10) earned their first sectional crown since 2012-13. It topped Whitmer in overtime before falling to Perrysburg.

"Coach talked to us about history when I was a junior," Bulger said. "We came together to set a goal to cut a net down at sectionals. That was the first goal. It feels great. I didn't think I'd accomplish first-team or we'd reach districts."

"It was great to be a part of."

Ross added freshman Brooklyn Baptista and junior Olivia Baptista to the program this season. Bulger averaged 16 points and 5.1 rebounds.

"People did different things to guard her and she found different ways to score," Vela said. "She's always re-

bounded well as a guard. She led the team. A competitive warrior. She just kept going at it and getting better and she never backed down from a challenge.

"She had 26 points against Whitmer and put her whole game together driving and shooting and led us to a victory."

Bulger added 17 points, including four 3-pointers against Perrysburg.

"She really improved," Vela said of Bulger's jumper. "She can take it to the hole and shoot. She's tough to guard."

Bulger didn't need encouragement from Vela to get better.

"I didn't have to always push her in the offseason," he said. "She was self-driven and she and her dad worked a lot. During the season they'd be working on Sunday. When she was young, she was raw."

"Every year, she fell more in love, pushed her talents and grew. She kept her bookwork in line and she's involved in clubs. She's a perfect example what a student-athlete should be."

Bulger took a step up and the rest of the team seemed to follow.

"The first couple games, you could tell it was a different group the way we played together," she said. "The girls and coaches are like a family. As the sea-
