A DISTASTEFUL DEFEAT

John Level's 43-point spectacular record performance at Bellevue last night helped ease the suffering feeling around town about Ross high basketball.

Ross high's smashing defeat by Elyria at Fremont last Friday, has caused considerable grumbling.

There's been a touchy feeling in the past on Ross high's case showing, especially in the past two or three years. Team hasn't been winning much but that isn't the real reason. They just don't look good in either victory or defeat.

The 96-11 plastering left a bitter taste.

What's wrong? This year's team isn't potentially strong but neither is it so weak that it has to absorb such a humiliating defeat.

Bigger reason seems to be discipline. Order is given but they just aren't obeyed. Coach Al Ziemke seemingly can't get the boys to put out for him. For example, during 24-11 at ballgame in the Elyria game, Ziemke must have given some instructions in the dressing room at halftime to be no change of tactics in the second half, walked into the second half on the floor only at intervals when his boys were being belted out on the court.

Practice sessions in the Ross gym are productive in the eyes of the players, in late years, some good prospects just haven't reported for them. That has hurt.

Fan support also is evidently lacking. The Ross boosters this season have backed the basketball team, contrary to gripes that the organization exists only for football. Fans support the football team and other Ross sports because they get a good show. They don't often have that opportunity at basketball games.

Larry Longmarch, Ross high, outstanding middle guard on defense, and John Level, rugged offensive fullback were named to the Ohio list of the eleven annual "Prep All-Americans." All Star football team originated and sponsored by the Wigwam Wigwag of America.

Named to the second of seven all-star teams was Jerry Hertin, 26-pound Marion Harding guard. So Ohio player made the first team in single games Friday, fourth, sixth, seventh, eighth, ninth and tenth. Huge Ross Sedan, 20-pound tackle of Cleveland Benedictine, was picked on the sixth team.

Five 71 To 67

Losing Streak Halted At 5; Fremont Host To Marion On Friday

Bellevue — John Level, 64 senior forward who transferred to Fremont Ross after his sophomore year at Jackson-Burgoon, set a new all-time Ross scoring record here last night with a 43-point output against Bellevue's Redmen.

Level's sizzling point production helped Ross end a five-game losing streak, the Little Giants winning 71-67.

It was another transfer student who previously held the Ross scoring mark. Gail Brauchle, who came to Fremont in his senior year from Angola, Indiana, established the old Ross standard of 36 points also against Bellevue in the 1934-35 season.

Level cannot 71 field goals and 12 of 12 free throws in marking up a new record in the victory.

Victory upped Fremont's season record to four wins, eight losses, same showing as Bellevue after Tuesday's defeat.

Next in scoring to Level was 27 guard Mark Walter with 14 points.

Ross was outscored from the floor 30 to 26 but 19 of 29 free throws while the Redmen were competing on only seven of 17.

Fremont played with the services of Chuck Woodhouse, regular guard, out with a 23-14 first quarter margin before Coach Al Ziemke's Little Giants took over.

Mainly on the spectacular point production of Level. The rebound snatched six field goals in the second period as Ross took command at halftime.

Level established the new record for three field goals and four free throws in the third quarter which ended with Ross at 58-47.

The new record holder finished his brilliant performance with five baskets and four charity shots in the fourth period.

Bellevue tied the score at 55-51 with six minutes remaining in the game on a two-point play by Jerry Crosby. Ken Falter put the Redmen ahead with a basket but Level's field goal at the 5:15 mark again knocked the score.

Phil Deady helped for Bellevue but Mike McCarty tipped in a corner header for Ross to tie the clubs at 56-59.

A free throw by Fred Middleton and basket by Level showed Ross in the lead 62-59 but Crosby rebounded the margin to a point with a basket. Level's basket and two free throws provided Fremont a 66-60 edge.

Two free throws by Dave Hutchins and a fender by Crosby narrowed Ross high lead to 66-65.

Middleton and Level sank field goals for Ross but Crosby kept the Redmen alive with a basket in the closing minutes.

Crosby was high scorer for Bellevue with 28 points followed by Deady with 20.

Ross Reserve Triumph

Ross high's Reserve also came out on top whipping Bellevue's seconds, 49-36. Freshman Jim Ohms paced the Fremont Reserve with 15 points. Denny Stea tossed in 12 and Harry Walter 11.

The Reserve of Coach Larry Willis scored consistently with nine in the first period, 12 in the second, 16 in the third and 12 in the fourth.

Ross has a Backery Conference engagement with Marion Harding in the Ross gym Friday night.

The Little Giants are 1-4 in the league with the only victory coming over Marion 56-49 at Marion.
