## Division I Sectional

Fremont Ross is heading into one of the tougher Division I sectional tournaments in the state, but coach Denny Ritchie said his team has the capability to place in the top three at Galion Country Club.

But his four seniors — Ollie Damschroeder, Mike Moxley, Kyle Peck and Doug Garvey — will have to play well.

"I hope our four seniors play up to what they are capable of, which is high 70s," said Ritchie. "If they do that, we can place third. I think a 73 or 74 will make it as an individual and all of our seniors can do that."

The Little Giants played at Galion Country Club a month and placed ninth in a tournament with 10 in the better golf teams in Ohio.

## Division II district

Lakota's Steve Adams and Margaretta's Dustin Cullen will participate in today's Division II district tournament at Sycamore Springs in Arlington.

Adams, a senior, shot a 78 to lead the Raiders to a seventh place finish at the sectional tournament at Dettwiler.

Cullen also shot a 78 as Margaretta finished 10th.

# Peck qualifies for district

GALION — Ross senior Kyle Peck earned a trip to the Division I district tournament, as he fired an 80 Friday in the sectional tournament at Galion Country Club.

Peck shot a 43 on the front nine and 37 on the back nine to take the second individual qualifying spot.

"He shot what he should have been shooting all year, and he did it in tough condi-

tions," said Ross coach Denny Ritchie. "He had two double (bogeys) too, so we think he can do well next week."

The Little Giants took eighth at the tough sectional, but five strokes separated the fourth and eighth place teams. Ashland won with a 305, Findlay was second with a 323 and Shelby

fired a 327.

Also for Ross, Doug Garvey fired an 82, Mike Moxley shot an 84, Ollie Damschroeder fired a 92 and A.J. Garza shot a 97.

"I'm real happy with the whole team," Ritchie said. "We shot a 360-something there four weeks ago at the Galion Invitational, so we really brought her down."

Peck will compete in the district Friday at Hawthorne Hills in Lima.

## Adams falls short

ARLINGTON — Lakota senior Steve Adams shot a 44-43—83 at the Division II sectional at Sycamore Springs, failing to qualify for the state tournament.

"He's done a very nice job," said Lakota coach Jim Balsizer. "He had an average of a little over 39 (for nine holes), and this is his second year in a row going to districts. He's had a very nice career at Lakota."
