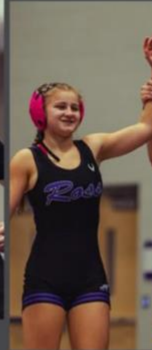

### Lady Giants Make History and Send Three to State at OHSAA Districts

The Fremont Ross High School girls wrestling team competed this past weekend at the OHSAA Girls Wrestling District Tournament held at Findlay High School, battling for a chance to advance to the OHSAA State Wrestling Championships. The Lady Giants rose to the challenge and will be sending three wrestlers to Columbus this weekend to compete among the best in the state.

It was an especially historic day for Keyonna Vann, who not only qualified for the state tournament but also achieved a remarkable milestone by recording her 100th career pin. Vann becomes the first Lady Giant in program history to reach that mark, cementing her place in Fremont Ross wrestling history. She finished the tournament in 3rd place at 235 pounds, adding another impressive accomplishment to her standout career.

The Lady Giants will be represented at the state tournament by three athletes who battled through a competitive district field to earn their spots. Kailani Long placed 2nd at 105 pounds, securing her first trip to the state championships after falling just short during her freshman season. Her dedication and hard work throughout the year paid off in a big way.

Joining her will be Malaya Hughes, who finished 4th at 100 pounds to punch her ticket to the state tournament. Hughes and Vann were both qualifiers and alternates last season, making this year's achievement even more meaningful as they officially earned their place among the state's best.

Also reaching the podium for Ross was Tamia Bounds, who placed 6th at 130 pounds. Bounds showed significant improvement from last season and continues to grow as a competitor.

Head coach Jen Long reflected on the emotional nature of district competition and the lessons that come with it.

"Districts is always emotional," Long said. "At this point in the season, it becomes more mental than physical, and that isn't always easy. We had a few ladies we thought had a strong chance to advance and unfortunately it didn't happen. Hopefully through those losses they gained experience and can learn how to cope with the pressure of high-level tournaments."

Coach Long also praised the progress of Bounds and the determination shown by the team throughout the season.

"Tamia made the podium with a sixth-place finish, which is an improvement from last season. We're excited to see what happens next year as she continues to grow and improve."

With three Lady Giants advancing, excitement is high as the team prepares for the trip to Columbus. For Hughes and Vann, qualifying this year carries special meaning after coming so close last season. For Long, it represents the payoff of a year of dedication and hard work.

All three wrestlers now stand among the top 16 in the state, and the Lady Giants program is eager to see how they perform on wrestling's biggest stage.

Congratulations to Keyonna Vann on making history with 100 career pins and to Kailani Long, Keyonna Vann, and Malaya Hughes on qualifying for the state championships. The entire Fremont Ross Athletics community is proud of you and will be cheering you on as you head to Columbus.
