## Scheduled For Action Today; Streaks Ousted

Fremont Ross and Tiffin Calvert are tentatively scheduled to play at 4 this afternoon in the finals of the Fremont Class AA Sectional baseball tournament at Anderson Field.

Winner of the Fremont tourney will meet the winner of the Mansfield tourney (Crestline high school) either Wednesday or Thursday in Mansfield.

Ross won its semifinal game yesterday over Fremont St. Joseph's Streaks 7-2 and Calvert toppled Eastwood 4-1. The Little Giants, now 6-1, have lost only to Calvert this season. St. Joe is now 9-5.

Dick Dundore, Ross lefty, allowed the Streaks only two hits, singles by Tom Kashmer and Bill Waggoner in the fifth inning. He struck out five and walked only one.

Starter Dave Miesle of St. Joe ran into control trouble in his 2 and two-thirds innings, issuing six bases-on-balls while striking out four. He was charged with all seven Ross runs and gave up four hits. Reliever Haldy Lawrence pitched air-tight ball the rest of the game, giving up no runs, four hits, fanning three and walking three.

There were no extra base hits in the game.

Ross tallied all of its runs in the second and third innings. In the second, Dan Moran received a walk from D. Miesle, Bill Johnson singled, Dundore walked, Roger Mann bunted safely just out of Miesle's reach to bring in a run. Johnson scored on a passed ball. Milt Hetrick walked and Jerry Jones walked.

### Four Runs

Ross third inning produced four runs. After one out, Moran singled and stole second, Johnson walked, Dundore forced Moran at third, Mann walked, Hetrick walked forcing in a run and bringing Lawrence to the mound for St. Joe. Jones singled to bring in a run and two others scored on errors in the inning.

St. Joe scored one run in the first on errors and a walk. The Streaks tallied one more run in the fifth on a single by Kashmer, wild pitch and single by Waggoner.

Calvert's Ted Rombach allowed Eastwood only two hits. Calvert had eight hits, single and double by Mike Hart, three singles by Frank Mongolio, two singles by Ken Williams and a double by Jim Wright.

# Calvert Wallops Fremont Ross In Sectional Final

## Tiffin Triumphs 15-2; Giants At Marion Today

Tiffin Calvert, undefeated in eight baseball games this season, cracked 14 base hits, took advantage of 10 Fremont Ross errors and captured the Fremont Class AA Sectional tournament here Tuesday by soundly whipping Ross 15-2 in the finals at Anderson Field.

Calvert now heads for Mansfield where the Senecas will clash with Crestline, the Mansfield Sectional winner, in the Sectional finals. Winner at Mansfield will battle the Defiance Sectional winner at Anderson Field, Fremont, 1:30 p. m. Saturday. Winner Saturday in the District finals moves on to the Regional at Delaware, O.

### 2 Losses To Calvert

Ross, now 6-2 for the season with both defeats to Calvert, traveled to Marion this afternoon to meet Marion Harding in a Buckeye Conference semifinal game. Winner will take on Lorain Friday at Fremont for the Buckeye Conference baseball championship. Friday's game will be in conjunction with All-Sports Day in the conference with host Fremont, Findlay, Marion, Sandusky, Elyria and Lorain battling in golf, tennis, track and baseball. Action will be at Roger Young Park in tennis, Harmon Field in track, Fremont Country Club in golf and Anderson Field in baseball.

In the previous Ross loss to Calvert, the Little Giants under Coach Cot Marquette lost 4-3 although Roger Hettrick and Dick Duadore held Calvert hitless. Errors and walks aided the initial Calvert triumph.

It was Ross errors plus the hard hitting of Calvert and their flawless fielding that led to the Seneca countians triumph yesterday. Pitcher Charles Reinhart, a steady righthander, also had much to do with Tiffin's success. He limited Ross to only three hits, singles by Harry Walter and Danny Moran in the first inning and a double by Roger Mann in the seventh. Reinhart struck out six and walked only two. At one stretch, he retired 13 straight Ross batters.

The Giants committed 10 errors to none for Tiffin. Starting Ross pitcher, righthander Gary Bierly was hit hard. He gave up five hits and six runs plus walking one and fanning one in one and two-thirds innings. Reliever, righthander Tom Lee gave up nine runs, nine hits, struck out five and walked one in four and one-third innings.

### Moran Plates Two

Moran drove in the lone Ross runs in the bottom of the first inning. Calvert had scored twice in the top of the first. The Senecas broke the 2-2 tie with a four-run, second frame. Three more runs came across in the fifth, one in the sixth and five in the seventh.

Catcher Jim Saad of Calvert drove in four runs with three singles, third baseman Tony Reed drove in three with three singles and he also played an excellent defensive game making several fine stops and throws, shortstop Jim Wright had a single and double, left fielder Jim Gillig drove in two runs with two singles, second baseman Mike Hart had two singles and first baseman Bob Altways a double. add 6 pt Ross Baseball
