Leslie ran the course in 10:15, one second off the record set last year by Stimpert of Ashland. John Barber shaded Don Yohe of Fremont for second place. Yohe's time of 10:30 broke the old Fremont record of 10:42, set in 1961 by Tom Koebel and Ron Brown.

Clarence Graves, Dave Butler and Bob Brown finished fourth, fifth and sixth in the meet, with Lin Potter, Tom Baxter and Mike Terry of Ross coming home seventh, ninth and 11th respectively. Potter at 10:53 and Baxter at 10:56 both had their best times.
