Ross bids adieu to BCC

Little Giants host conference track and field meet

One thing will definitely change Saturday at the Buckeye Central Conference Track and Field Meet. The competition will be the last for a Fremont Ross sports team in the BCC.

Other than that, Lancaster's

boys and Findlay's girls will likely run off with their fourth conference team titles.

Ross will host the fourth BCC meet as it bids goodbye to the BCC while preparing to enter Great Lakes League competition next fall.

"Lancaster," Ross coach John

Elder said quickly when assessing the boys meet. "They could be a better team than what they were (in the previous three conference meets).

"They have their state cross country team running track and that should allow them to take the top two spots in the distan-

cevents," Elder said. "They have good balance and depth all the way through."

B.J. Holland and Todd Walker lead the Lancaster distancemen. Holland was third in the state in the 3200 in 1990 and was third in

Lancaster, Findlay 'fourpeat'

The San Francisco 49ers and Detroit Pistons can step aside, Lancaster and Findlay high schools have done them one better.

While the 49ers failed to "threepeat" in the Super Bowl and Detroit is slugging it out attempting to "threepeat" in the National Basketball Association Playoffs, Lancaster's boys and Findlay's girls have "fourpeated."

Webster will not adapt "fourpeat" but Lancaster and Findlay will put it down in their athletic dictionaries because Saturday at the Ross High School track, the Golden Gales and Trojans won their fourth consecutive Buckeye Central Conference championships.

Ross was second — for the fourth time — in the boys meet and finished a "strong" fifth in the girls meet.

It marked the final time for Ross competition in the BCC. Ross begins competing in Great Lakes League next fall.

Ross coach John Elder, a swami who uses a shot put for a crystal ball, made the the logical prediction for the BCC meet.

"Yes, yes I did," Elder said as a chilly wind raked the Ross track. "I predicted right — Lancaster and Findlay would win."

Looking at the first three BCC meets, it was logic, not prognostication.

Lancaster racked up 133 points, Ross a distant 76½, and Newark had 62 for third. Zanesville was fourth with 30½ and Findlay had 28½.

In the girls meet, Findlay had 97 in the more closely packed standings. Lancaster was second with 70, Newark had 65, Zanesville 53 and Ross 49.

While Lancaster and Findlay took the team honors, Ross had the meet's outstanding boys performer, sophomore Tyrone "Toddy" Price. Zanesville also stole a bit of thunder from Findlay's girls as junior Laurency Wyatt won her third outstanding performer award.

Price won the 200 in 23.61 seconds, shading teammate Todd Clark by .14 seconds.
