

Tournament play could resemble league playoffs, especially in Division I, following Sunday's drawings to determine pairings for the 2022 OHSAA baseball tournament.


Four teams that have all been battling for the top spot in the Three Rivers Athletic Conference are paired up in the lower bracket of the Bowling Green Sectional/District field. Findlay, which used a 7-2 win over Toledo St. John's to take over first place in the TRAC standings, will face Fremont Ross at 5 p.m. on May 18 in a district quarterfinal matchup. Fremont Ross had owned a share of the TRAC lead until suffering back-to-back losses to Toledo Whitmer and St. John's.

St. John's and Whitmer, ironically, are paired up in the other half of Findlay's bracket and will also square off on May 18. The winners of those two games will clash at 7 p.m. May 26 at Bowling Green.

Division IV teams will kick off OHSAA tournament play on May 17. Division I, II and III teams will be action on May 18.

Findlay High School baseball defeated Fremont Ross 3-2 on May 19, 2022, in a Division I sectional final. Ben Best led the Trojans by throwing a complete game with 10 strikeouts and delivering a game-winning RBI single in the bottom of the seventh inning.

- **Result:** Findlay 3, Fremont Ross 2.
- **Winning Pitcher:** Ben Best (allowed 2 runs on 3 hits, struck out 10).
- **Key Performers:** Ben Best (2-1B, RBI), Hunter Sertell (2-1B, RBI), S. Weihrauch (3B).
- **Game Context:** The win allowed Findlay to advance in the tournament, improving their record to 15-7 at the time.
