Football and basketball star Archie Tunnell, Port Clinton senior, proved he is just as valuable on the cinder path Friday night at Harmon Field when he won four events to help his team to an 80 to 38 track win over Fremont Ross.

Tunnell won the 100-yard dash in 10.5, both hurdles races and the broad jump.

# Ross Second To Clay In 3-Way Track Meet

Ross finished second to Clay in a triangular track meet at Bowling Green Friday.

Clay won with 62 1-6 points. Coach John Ihnat's Ross thinlies scored 52 1-3 and Bowling Green 34 1/2.

Rein Walter of Ross ran the 440-yard dash in the winning time of 54.7 seconds; Dick Gwinup won the 880-yard run in 2 minutes, 13.4 seconds; the Ross mile relay team of Walter, Bill Cloyd, Walt Pasch and Doug Atkins won in the time of 3 minutes, 45.6 seconds; and Skip Baker won the broad jump with a leap of 18 feet, 1 inch.

Atkins finished second to Walter in the 440-yard dash and the 880-yard relay team of Ross high of Cloyd, Lee Love, Marv Hines and Bob Jahns placed second in that event. John Nighswander, freshman, was second in the 180-yard low hurdles and Jahns second in the 220-yard dash. Bud Gahn took second in the shot put, Baker tied for second in the pole vault and Jahns tied for second in the high jump.

In the mile relay, Atkins ran a 56 second 440, Pasch 57 seconds, Cloyd 59 seconds and Walter 53 seconds as anchorman.

The 880-yard relay team of Ross had a second best time of 1:39.1 seconds with Cloyd running his 220 in 25 seconds, Love in 25, Hines in 26 and Jahns in 23.1 as anchorman.

Ross high won only three first places as Genoa defeated Coach John Ihnat's Little Giant tracksters 73 to 45 at Harmon Field Thursday.

Fremont's 880-yard relay team of Bill Cloyd, Marvin Hines, Jim Rohrbacker and Bob Jahns came in first in the splendid time of one minute, 38.2 seconds. The Ross mile relay team (Dave Pasch, Mike Cochran, Charles Johnson and Rein Walter) won its event in 3 minutes, 46.5 seconds. Other first for Ross was scored by Rein Walter in the 440-yard dash in 54.5

Jack Larimer of Genoa won the 100-yard dash in the sparkling time of 10.1 seconds, copped the 180-yard low hurdles in 21 seconds and the 220-yard dash in 23.4 seconds. Gabe Gongorra took first for Genoa in the mile and half mile.

# Giants Edge

## Fostoria 60-58

A victory in the mile relay and one point in the last event of the afternoon gave Fremont Ross its first track triumph of the 1958 season, Coach John Ihnat's Little Giants thinlies edging Fostoria 60 to 58 at Harmon Field Monday.

The Ross thinlies will try for their second straight success this afternoon at Sandusky against the favored SHS tracksters.

Ross led 54 to 50 after 12 of the 14 track and field events. A win in the mile relay, giving the Giants five points to none for Fostoria, would guarantee at least a tie for Ross since no more than nine points could be realized by Fostoria in the final event, the broad jump.

**The Ross mile relay team of Bob Atkins, Dave Pasch, Mike Cochran and Rein Walter stepped the distance in 3 minutes, 47.9 seconds to give Fremont five points and a 59 to 50 edge.**

Dwight Kimble of Fostoria won the broad jump with a leap of 19 feet, 5¾ inches; teammate Jerry Ramsey was second to give Fostoria eight points. However, third place and one point was taken by Richard (Skip) Baker of Ross with a jump of 18 feet, 1½ inches to give Ross its final two point margin.

Ross first places were recorded by Jack Wymer in the 120-yard high hurdles in 18.7 seconds; mile run, won by Duane Hack, 5 minutes, 3.4 seconds; 440-yard run, won by Rein Walter, 55.4 seconds; pole vault, won by Baker, height 11 feet; shot put, won by Larry Nitschke, 40 feet, 3¼ inches; 880-yard run, won by Dick Gwinup, 2 minutes, 11.8 seconds, best time of the year for Ross high's Gwinup.

Kimble added a win in the 100-yard dash and the 180-yard low hurdles to his winning leap in the broad jump for Fostoria.

# Sandusky Tops Ross Thinlies

SANDUSKY — Sandusky's favored track team handed Fremont Ross an 88½ to 29½ spanking here Tuesday, the Blue Streaks winning nine of 14 events. One first place was shared.

Bob Jahns won the 100-yard dash in 10.6 seconds and the 220-yard dash in 24 seconds to pace Coach John Ihnat's Little Giants. Bob Atkins won the 440-yard run in 53.6 seconds and Dick Gwinup the 880-yard run in 2 minutes, 12.7 seconds for other Fremont firsts. John Nighswander of Ross and Peters of Sandusky tied in the 180-yard low hurdles in 23.5 seconds.

Richard (Skip) Baker of Ross tied for second in the pole vault won by Haskins of Sandusky with a leap of 10 feet, 9 inches.

Dick Clinebell placed third in the 120-yard high hurdles, Bud Gahn third in the shot put, Baker third in the broad jump and Jahns tied for third in the high jump for the other Ross high points.
