ROSS DEFENDS DISTRICT TITLE

Althoff Depends On Team That Won Buckeye In District Meet

Coach Whitey Althoff will depend virtually upon the same team that won the Buckeye League track meet last Saturday to carry the Little Giants to their second district title over in Sandusky Saturday, he announced today.

There will probably be 10 teams entered in the A division this year, and the chief competition is expected to come from Mansfield, Tiffin Columbian and Bellevue, although Ashland may prove troublesome as Coach Althoff has but a meager line on their ability this season.

Last year the Little Giants copped the event with 50 points, Ashland finishing second with 42 and Sandusky third with 36. He believes that 50 points will again take the big meet.

There will be preliminaries in all events except the relays, mile and half-mile runs starting at 9:30 a.m., with the finals scheduled for 1:45 p.m. If any changes are made in the Fremont team, it will be in the 440, as Coach Althoff said he could not expect Capt. Clarence Chestnutwood, or anyone else, to run both preliminaries and finals in all three sprints the same day.

This is the first time in the history of the meet that trial heats have been booked for the quarter-mile.

The Class B meet will be run along with the upper division. In this bracket the undefeated Clyde team must be favored with perhaps Genoa, Oak Harbor and Elmore providing the most competition.
