# Marion Track Winner, Elyria Golfers First

By Elyria, Sandusky

Marion Harding swept track honors as expected on Buckeye Conference Sports Day at Elyria Friday with 95½ points.

Next to Marion were Lorain 44½, Sandusky 42, Elyria 33, Fremont Ross 11½ and Findlay 7¾.

Two new records were set and one tied. Vaughn Williams of Marion threw the discus 154 feet to top the record of 151 feet, 8¾ inches set in 1956 by Marion's Gary Huber. Ken Deshuk of Lorain set a new record of 15.3 seconds in the 120-yard high hurdles; and Tom Doan, Elyria, high jumped 6 feet even to tie the record of Gail Brauchla of Ross set in 1956.
