Can 'Cats beat No. 1?

The Woodmore girls cross country team is aiming for a championship repeat, while two area individual runners have their sights set on the top spot in league cross-country meets; to be held Saturday at several courses.

Woodmore, ranked fourth in the most recent Division III coaches poll, will have its hands full with Eastwood, the No. 1 team in Division II, at the Suburban Lakes League meet at Fremont's Walsh Park.

The Wildcats squeaked past Eastwood, 42-44, last year and return top runners Casey Ulinski and Meredith Magsig, who finished second and third, respectively, last year. Woodmore beat Eastwood in a dual meet earlier this season, taking the top three spots.

"We sure hope we have a shot," Wildcats first-year coach Craig Nieset said. "Our top three are running real strong and 4-6 are improving. That's exactly what we want to happen."

Meanwhile, Fremont Ross's Jeremy Framstad and Oak Harbor's Jackie Baumgartner are looking to win individual titles at

the Great Lakes League and Sandusky Bay Conference meets, respectively, after near-misses last year.

Framstad, a junior, placed fourth at last year's meet and is expected to battle with Findlay's Brian Roberts for the top spot at the GLL meet, which will be run at Riverbend Reservoir in Findlay. Roberts beat Framstad in a dual meet, but Framstad has won the big-meet meetings between the two runners.

Ross coach John Elder, though, said Findlay should rule the boys run.

"We're hoping for second," Ross coach John Elder said. "We'll see how things go. In all the big invitational meets, we've beaten Whitmer."

"The league is not as deep as it has been."

The Ross girls are hoping for a top-10 performance from Stacy Hall, who finished 18th last year at the GLL meet. The Little Giants are aiming for a second-place finish behind Findlay as well.

"If we run a good race and have a good day, it's very possible we could do

Meanwhile at the Midland Athletic League meet, to be held at Ell's Park in Bettsville, the state-ranked St. Joseph boys
