## Rose Entered In 50-Yard Event

Ross high school is favored to win its seventh straight district swimming meet Saturday at Bowling Green.

Preliminaries are slated to start at 2 p. m., with the finals at 3 in the university natatorium. All boys who finish in the first six will be eligible to compete in the state finals at Columbus in the Ohio State University pool the following week.

Coach George Gruse indicated today that he is banking on the 200-yard free-style relay team to bring the Giants the district and state championships. That event is worth 14 points for first place, 10 for second, 8 for third, 6 for fourth, 4 for fifth and 2 for sixth. The medley relay will be scored 12-9-7-5-3-1, while all other events will be scored 7-5-4-3-2-1.

Gruse is running Jack Rose in the 50-yard free-style. The versatile swimmer, holder of the local pool and school record in the only time he swam the 150-yard medley in scholastic competition, has been entered in the 100-yard free-style in most meets in his three-year career.

Also in the 50-yard free-style will be George Hirschberger, two-time state champ; Jack Bovard and Jack Balsizer.

The Giants have finished first in 16 district meets which is annually won by either Ross or Sandusky, those schools the only ones entering full squads. Ross has captured six state championships, finished second five times and third twice. Ross last won the state title in 1943.

# Free-Style Relayers Break Mark As 18 Giants Qualify For Finals

Fremont Ross swimmers, like a finely-trained race horse and a skilled jockey awaiting the starter's "go" sign, are set for their biggest venture of the year after smashing scoring records in the District meet at Bowling Green Saturday.

The Giants rang up 106 points, an all-time high, Sandusky finished second with 74. Toledo Waite was third with 17 and Toledo Scott took fourth with 2. Rosse qualified 18 boys, 11 of them in two events. Boys who finished in the first six qualify for the state finals.

The showdown is slated to start Friday afternoon with preliminaries in the Ohio State pool. The second leg of the state meet will be contested Saturday afternoon. The Ross squad will depart on Thursday.

The Ross free-style relay team, composed of Jock Rose, Ned Frantz, Bob Lucas and George Hirschberger, set a new District meet record when they swam the 200 yards in 1:41.8. The old record was 1:42.7, set by Ross in 1950. That team was composed of Dick Burkett, Charles Miller, Jim Sherer and Bud Nord.

## Lauber Also Scores

Sandusky's brilliant Ben Lauber also set a record in the 150-yard individual medley with the time of 1:46.4, bettering the old mark by 3.2 seconds.

Coach George Gruse made a lineup switch after getting to B. G. He announced he would put Jack Rose in the 50-yard free-style, along with George Hirschberger, local state champion, but once on the scene he restored Rose to the 100-yard race. Both came in winners, with Rose getting the decision by an eyelash over Mike Tschirret, of Toledo Waite. Three of the five judges picked Rose, the others picked Tschirret.

Other individual victors for Fre-

mont were Merlin Eversole, up-and-coming junior back stroker, and Larry Hunt, veteran diver. Eversole usually finished behind teammate Gary Schwartz, but he won over Schwartz for the second time this season.

Hunt, as expected, had no trouble in the diving. He collected 130.85 points to 109.95 for the second boy, McNeil of Waite.

## Four Giants Second

Fremont nabbed four seconds. Bill Faunce trailed Tom McBane, of Sandusky, in the breast-stroke. Ned Frantz was behind Tschirret in the 200-yard free-style. Schwartz was runner-up to Eversole in the back-stroke, and Bruce Sherer came in second as Lauber made his record-shattering effort.

The Ross medley relay team lost a thriller to Sandusky's crack trio of Wilke, McBane and Lanker, the Giants' Schwartz, Frantz and Lucas being just four-tenths of a second behind.
