# SCHOOL CHAMPS IN MAKING ON COLUMBUS FIELD

Sandusky Again Out in  
Front; Ross High  
Qualifies

COLUMBUS, O., May 25.—**AP**—Before nightfall state high school champions in golf, baseball, tennis and track will have been crowned.

A galaxy of youthful stars, survivors of district eliminations and preliminary tournament play, battled today for ribbons, medals and trophy cups.

Action was plentiful with the track meet headlining the program. It attracted the majority of the 1,000 athletes who have assembled here for the tournaments.

Either Cleveland Collinwood or Sandusky was favored to annex the Class A track title now held by Toledo Scott, although the defenders threatened to put up a stiff fight.

Twenty eight schools placed one man or more in preliminary events yesterday, with Collinwood and Sandusky leading with four men each and their 880-relay teams. Scott qualified four men.

Delta also was given little chance to successfully defend its crown in Class B and Glendale was the favorite to take it away. Twenty seven schools put qualifiers in this division.

#### Ideal Weather

Ideal weather increased prospects for record breaking feats, which were indicated as the result of performances in district events.

On the baseball diamond, Cincinnati Roger Bacon and Toledo Libbey clashed for the pennant. Having the advantage of a great hurling staff, the Cincinnati nine was given the edge. They are Class A schools.

Besides Collinwood, Sandusky and Scott, Class A teams which qualified in yesterday's preliminary events in the 100 and 220 yard dashes, 120 and 220 yard low hurdles, 440 run, and 880 relay are:

# NEW STATE CHAMPS CROWNED SATURDAY

COLUMBUS, O., May 27.—*AP*—Only the cheers of state champions echoed today in the closing Ohio's high school scholastic athletic season.

Crowned here Saturday in an athletic festival that attracted 1,000 youths, the champions are:

In baseball—Cincinnati Roger Bacon for class A; Brookville for class B.

In track—Toledo Scott for class A; Glendale for class B.

In golf—Bob Bingham, Cleveland Shaker Heights, and the team of Toledo Libbey.

In tennis—Paul Graebner of Lakewood, and the doubles team of Cincinnati Hughes.

Roger Bacon defeated Toledo Libbey in the finals of the class A tournament, 8 to 3. Brookville took the class B title in an extra inning encounter with Reading, 4 to 3.

Possessing power in nearly all events, Toledo Scott's track team successfully defended its champion by scoring 36½ points. Cleveland East tech and Sandusky ended a merry battle in a tie for second place with 24 points and Cleveland Collinwood was third with 10.
