

Eleven Purple and White Men Entered at Big Oberlin Meet

Coach Vanorsdal and a squad of 11 high school athletes that includes such well known stars of the track and field as Harold Wendler, Allen Brokate, Tim McCarthy, Kreilick, Jones, Thatcher, Hunsinger, Dunigan, the Henne brothers and Lawrence, will leave for Oberlin Saturday morning to engage in the annual Little Big Six track and field meet in which all the schools of the tidy little outfit will mingle for high honors.

Fremont's stars are not of the general ability that almost took the meeting by storm in 1921 but Wendler, Kreilick, Jones and Brokate, as well as some of the other boys will be heard from in first place in their pet events, before the sun goes to rest Saturday evening.

WENDLER ENDS HI CAREER IN BLAZE OF GLORY

Harold Wendler, probably the greatest all around star that ever represented Fremont high school in any line of athletics, ended his high school career in a great blaze of glory Saturday afternoon.

It happened at Oberlin, where the star performer and about ten of his teammates were representing the purple and white in the sixth annual track and field meet of the Little Big Six organization.

The local outfit had no possible chance of winning the meet, all it cared for was to make a respectable showing. Elyria, Lorain and Sandusky with their all star aggregations were expected to cop top honors and they did.

Wendler, who graduated from high school last week, took his turn in the broad jump and when his effort was looked over and affixed in the score book, a new record for the event had been created. The clever Fremonter leaped 21 feet and $\frac{3}{4}$ inches and was given a big hand by the audience. It was a fit ending to a great scholastic career and the clever star gives evidence of repeating his great work when he enters O. S. U. next fall.

Sandusky won the meeting with 49½ points; Lorain was second with 46½ points to its credit; Oberlin was third with 45 points; Elyria did its best and got 33 markers, while Fremont got 24½ points. Norwalk was lucky to gather 7½, and little Bellevue slipped in with 2 points.

The meeting was hotly contested. Krellick of Fremont, won the high jump with a mark of 5 feet 6 inches. Fremont picked off 12½ points in the jumps, 6 in the weights, 4 in the distance events and 2 in the dashes.
