## TRACK MEET AT COUNTY TRACK NEXT MONDAY

Coach Ross has scheduled a track meet for the fair ground to be held Monday afternoon when stars of the county schools as shown from the results of the recent county school meet will be entered in the various events against the Fremont high school.

Among the enteries will be "Butch" Miller the Townsend Terror who has proved the sensation of the county in recent meets and who took a number of first at the recent county meet, including the polevault, 8 lb. shot put, and the high jump. In the broad jump he finished third to Smtzer of Townsend and Baechele of Clyde.

In addition to the Townsend star, Colvin who is a weight star, Meek, who has been going good i nth mile and Haff a dash man are expected to enter Swint in the sprints.

Clyde will enter Ensign who finished in front in both the mile and half at the couny meet, Kowalk for the 880, Gabel, a high jumper and White, a sprinter who has been making them all sit up and take notice.

Shutt, who won the javelin throw here and Krotzer who won the 220 and finished second in the 100 yard dashes respectfully, will come from Gibsonburg.

Ross will send all of his fellows into the events during the day as he is anxious to keep them in trim for the Little Big Seven meet to be held at Oberlin, June 5th.

In addition to the meet scheduled for Monday he is endeavoring to schedule a meet with Lakeside high for Thursday of next week, feeling that they will be able to put up some stiff competition for his athletes, for they are said to have a crackerjack squad, holding the Ottawa county championship.

# **KAUBLE ONLY WINNER OVER F. H. S. STARS**

**Clyde Youth Took Only First Away  
From F. H. S. at Track Meet**

The track meet in which the winners of events in the recent county schools meet were to have appeared against the Fremont high track squad failed to bring out the boys from the country schools, only Clyde and Townsend being represented and the Purple and White had an easy time taking the meet, winning every first with the exception of the high jump, which Kauble of Clyde copped.

When the scores were counted at the close of the meet it was found that Fremont had a total of 73 1-2 with the county representatives having 21 1-2 to their credit.

Kauble, the only first from the county, cleared the bar at five feet, six inches in the high jump. Althoff and Meincer finished second and third. Most of the other events were taken one, two by the Rossmen.

The meet scheduled with Lakeside for Thursday night of this week has been cancelled, it being impossible to obtain the use of the fair ground for that day.
