Little Giant tennis team has experience, talent

A nucleus of five returning lettermen will lead the Ross High School boys tennis team

this spring.

Seniors John Battles and Tom Herlihy and juniors Tom Myers, Ramon Eickert and Kevin Brooks are the lettermen on which Coach Pete Michaels will be building the fortunes of the Little Giants.

"Right now," Michaels assessed his team's practices, "the kids are playing good tennis. I don't want to put them out on a limb or anything, but

they are playing well.

"All of them are hustling," the Ross coach continued. "There were 27 kids out and I cut down to 17. Four of the ones that were cut asked if they could stay out and practice with the team. I have allowed that because they could develop into better players somewhere down the line."

The Little Giants open today at 4 p.m., at Tiffin Columbian.

Myers, Battles and Eickert will open at the first through third singles, respectively, for Michaels.

"All three singles players are returning from last year's team," Michaels said. "Eickert and Myers played singles last year, but they also saw doubles

action."

In doubles, Brooks has the most experience. He will be teamed with junior John Cahill, out for the sport for the first time. The first doubles team will be comprised of non-lettering senior Brian Casselman and sophomore Mark Moyer. Herlihy could work his way onto one of the doubles teams at some point in the season, Michaels said.

"The second doubles team -

Brooks and Cahill — is very quick," Michaels described. "There is no shot they feel they cannot return. Moyer, in the first doubles, is as good a sophomore as I have right now.

"With five of the top seven being lettermen, I think it will be hard to move them (out of the lineup)," the Ross coach projected, "but I feel that several of them will be challenged."

Michaels said he feels his team will "play some good tennis."

"It all depends on how much they want to win," he said. "All of the players possess good fundementals; the rest of their game is on top of their shoulders."

One of the top individuals coming back is defending first court singles champ Dave Binder of Lorain Senior.


Ross's best shots at a championship will come in the third court singles and the second doubles, said Michaels.
