Findlay Wins Buckeye Crown; Shaw's Discus Record Broken

THE DIFFERENCE



Ross high school's track team finished fifth in the Buckeye League meet at Findlay Saturday as Findlay successfully defended its championship.

The victorious Trojans compiled 66 1/4 points. Fostoria pulled a surprise by edging Marion for the runner-up spot, the Redmen getting 48 points to the Presidents' 47. Bowling Green was fourth with 27, Ross had 20 and Tiffin 15 1/2.

The record discus throw set by Ross high's Bob Shaw went by the boards as Dave Witte of Bowling Green came up with a heave of 143 feet, 5 7/8 inches, seven-eighths of an inch further than the Fremont athlete. Shaw's mark was set in 1940.

Glover Wins Broad Jump
Charlie Glover gave Ross its only first, winning the broad jump with a leap of 19 feet, 8 1/4 inches. John Allen came in third for the Giants in the shot put and Eric Haskins was fourth in the mile run. Billy Smith obtained a tie for third place in the pole vault. The Ross mile relay team got a second. Findlay won the event but was disqualified, giving Tiffin the first-place points.
