Ross Golfers Drop Opener Against Tiffin

TIFFIN — Fremont Ross golfers were handed a rude welcome to the season here Monday as Tiffin Columbian recorded a 14½-5½ victory. Only one of the five Ross linksmen was able to best his foe in the five-man match.

John Davis, Ross number two man, tied with Bob Williams of Columbian for medalist honors with a 42. Davis also took four points from his opponent, Sam McKinney, for the only Ross match victory.

Bill Wingard, Ross number one golfer, managed to salvage one point as he finished one stroke behind Williams, the medalist for Columbian.

The team match actually went 14 holes before being called on a cold windy day. Scores posted were for the first nine holes.

State Power Findlay Tops Ross Golfers

FINDLAY — The team which won the district title and finished fourth in the state tournament in 1965 showed why it is an early favorite for the state title here Wednesday. Findlay golfers trimmed visiting Ross on the Findlay Country Club course, 15-1.

Two-time district champion Tom Norris of Findlay was match medalist with a 76 on rounds of 39 and 37. In posting the medal score Norris took four points from Ross low man Bill Wingard, who shot an 85.

All four golfers for Findlay equalled or bettered the 85 low for the Ross team.

Jeff Gibbs and Bob VanHook, a pair of sophomores who played three and four men, accounted for the only Ross scoring. Each garnered a half point. Gibbs had a shot at taking three until he three-putted the final hole.

Ross Golfers Open At Home With Defeat

Ross golfers had trouble opening their home season at Fremont Country Club Thursday afternoon. They engaged in close matches with Marion, but despite similar medal scores the Little Giants were defeated 16½-4½.

Number one Ross golfer Bill Wingard was medalist for the day with an 80 and managed the only match win for the home team. Wingard put together consistent rounds of 41-39-78 on the Fremont course.

Wingard's opponent and two other Marion golfers shared the low for the visiting team with rounds of 82 strokes. Also firing 82 for Marion were Malcolm Goodman, number two man, and Mike Feder, the Marion fifth man. Both Goodman and Feder shut out their Ross opponents, taking four points each.

In two of the matches lost by Ross golfers only one stroke separated the one boy from victory and two strokes meant defeat for the other.

In scoring high school matches a new system is being employed. The scoring system awards one point for low medal each nine holes, one point for low medal for 18 and one point for match on the 18 holes. In addition one team point is awarded to the team with the low total medal strokes.

It all came down to the fifth and final man at Fremont Country Club Friday afternoon and Ross' Mike Wing responded to the pressure. Wing took two and one-half points to give Ross a 10½-9½ victory over Perkins on the local links. The victory gave Ross its second victory of the season against four losses.

In the first four matches Ross had taken one and Perkins one, both with three points, and two had been split. The fifth man was the deciding one and Wing beat his opponent by two strokes to take two of three medal points and split the match point.

Ross number one golfer Bill Wingard was medalist with a pair of 41 rounds for an 82-stroke 18-hole total. With this score he captured three points. Wingard had an eagle two on the ninth hole. In the number two match Jeff Gibbs equalled the 84 of his opponent but dropped three points. Craig Wright and Bob Van Hook then halved their matches to set the stage for Wing's clincher.

Medalist for Perkins was Bob Strang, who played Gibbs, with an 84.

Ross will have two more warmups before competing in the Buckeye Conference tournament to be held at Fremont Country Club May 2. Tuesday Ross will be host to Sandusky and Thursday it will be Findlay, defending district champ, at the local club.
