# Prep track

TOLEDO — The boys 4x800 relay team from Fremont Ross has advanced to regional competition after winning a district championship Tuesday.

The team of Kurt Snyder, Dane Snyder, Clint Hill and Jeremiah Wagner finished in 8 minutes, 18 seconds

The district meet continues Saturday.

Brandon Willer also advanced to the regional meet next week<sup>N</sup> at Oak Harbor, throwing the shot put 48 feet, 7 inches. Willer placed third in the event.

The top four finishers in each event qualify for the regional, which begins May 25.

Two Little Giants just missed qualifying. Shawn Tooman placed sixth in the pole vault after clearing 11-6, and Chris Shull was fifth in the shot put with a throw of 44-10.

# Ross boys finish 2nd in district meet; Woodmore 3rd, St. Joe 7th

Fremont Ross was second and Woodmore third in boys district track and field meets Saturday.

In other team finishes, Fremont St. Joseph Central Catholic was seventh, Gibsonburg 10th and Bettsville 16th.

## Division I

Ross had 90 points, 10 behind winner Toledo Central Catholic in the meet at Start High School.

The top four finishers in each event advanced to the regional meet at Oak Harbor High School Thursday and Saturday.

Saturday, Jerry Cutcher, Dane Snyder and Jeremiah Wagner won individual events for the Little Giants. Cutcher captured the 110 hurdles in 15.8 seconds and Sny-

der won the 1600 in 4 minutes, 36.1 seconds. Doug Jibilian of Ross was third in the 1600 in 3:37.2.

Wagner won the 3200 in 10:09.5 with Jeremiah Smith of Ross missing a regional berth with a fifth place finish in 10:37.5.

Other Saturday Ross district I meet finishes qualifying for the regional meet were Brand Miller with thirds in the shot put (48 feet, 6½ inches) and the discus (134-8); Justin Conklin second in the long jump (18-9); Dane Snyder in the 800 (2:02.2) and Nate Rhodes in the 400 (52.8).

The Ross 4x800 team of Dane and Curt Snyder, Wagner and Clint Hill won the event on Tuesday in 8:18.

## Division III

Woodmore with 59 points trailed winner Fostoria St. Wendelin 95 and Liberty Center 75. St. Joe had 32, Gibsonburg 15 and Bettsville 3 at Bowling Green.

Jared Overmyer won the pole vault (13-0) and Bob Davis won the 100 (11.1) for Woodmore. The Wildcats also won the 4x100 (45.2).

Davis was also fourth in the long jump (19-7 1/2). Other Woodmore finishes included Mike Perkins third in the discus (143-6); Kyle Heins fourth in the 110 hurdles; and Tony Elder fourth in the 1600 (4:45.0).

Brent Fahle of Gibsonburg won the 800.

St. Joe's best finishes included thirds by Aaron Pollick in the pole vault (11-6); Alisha Jackson in the long jump (19-10 3/4); Derrick Denman in the 110 hurdles; Paul Grahl third in the 100 (11.2); and Jon Burroughs in the 3200 (10:28.7).

At Willard, Old Fort was sixth behind winner Seneca East's 94. The Stockaders had 47.

Nick Burks won the high jump

(5-10) and Keith Franklin won the 400 (53.0) to pace the Stockaders. Scott Wilkinson finished second in the shot put (49-2 1/2) and was fourth in the discus (129-0). Brock Cleveland was second in the 1600 (10:22.4).

Other Old Fort finishes included a third in the 4x800 (8:41.9).

The top four finishers advance to the regional in Fostoria Thursday and Saturday.

Noel Blake was first in the high jump with a leap of 4 feet, 10 inches and Nicole Camper was second (4-9) for Woodmore.

Andrea Jensen won the 1600 (5 minutes, 27.8 seconds) and was second in the 800 (2:29.2) for Woodmore. The Wildcats 4x200

relay won in 1:52.3 and the 4x400 was first in 4:15.5. The Woodmore 4x800 won on Thursday in 10:25.

Other Woodmore finishes included Rachel Harder second (15.8) and Lindsay Kuhlman fourth (16.7) in the 100 hurdles; Lindsey Hamilton fourth in the 1600 (5:38.1); Ellie Kanipe, second in the 400 (1:02); and Harder fourth in the 300 hurdles (48.3).

Sarah Yeager won the 400 in 59.1 for St. Joe. She also finished third in the 200 (27.2). Elizabeth Steirwalt of St. Joe won the 3200 in 12:57.2.

Other St. Joe finishes included Michelle Celek fourth in the high

jump (4-9); the 4x100 relay third in 54.1; and the 4x400 relay, second in 4:18.9.

Brooke Bowe of Gibsonburg finished third in 3200 in 13:07.9.

At Willard, Old Fort was fourth with 36 points. Seneca East won with 106.

Heidi Burks won the high jump (5-0) and finished fourth in the 800 (2:25.9).

Other Stockader finishes included a second by Clara Caudill in the long jump (16-0 1/4) and a fourth in the 4x200 relay (1:53.6).

The top four individual qualified for the regional meet Thursday and Saturday in Fostoria.

Mansfield won the meet with 84 points. Lexington was second

with 69½ and Ross had 53.

Jami Toeppke won the 1600 and 3200 for Ross in 5:15.5 and 11:41.9. Wednesday, Ross won the 4x800 (Sarah Williams, Alison Kelly, Carrie Gill and Toeppke) in 9:50.

Other finished for Ross included a second by Williams in the 800 (2:23.2); Shannon Heidelberg fourth in the long jump (15-9 1/2); Tonya Elder fourth in the 100 hurdles (16-5) and the 4x100 (Tori Kille, Elder, Heidelberg and Marcy Reinbolt) fourth in 50.8.

Ross will run in the regional at Oak Harbor Thursday and Saturday.
