

# Ross *netters* *ousted*

TOLEDO — The overcast and rainy skies fit perfectly with the fortunes of the Fremont Ross tennis team Friday in the Class AAA Sectional Tennis Tournament.

All three singles players and both doubles teams were eliminated from further play with losses in either the first or second round.

Stuart Dorsky and Brent Borden in singles, and Rick Howell and Barry Kiser in doubles won first round matches for Ross but lost in the second round of play. Pete Werling and Rich Shurmer, Ross's second doubles team, drew a bye in the first round but lost in the second.

"The people that won in the first round played well," Ross Coach Lee Dailing said, "but the competition got a lot stronger in the second round, but they still played well in losing."

Dorsky downed Todd Henne of Napoleon 0-6, 6-3, 6-2, in his first round match but was felled 6-2, 6-2, by Whitmer's Dave Karp in his second round match. Borden dropped his first set in the first round to Dwayne Johnson of Napoleon 5-7 but came back to win the final two sets 6-3 and 6-2.

In his second round match, Borden went up against Sylvania's Beth Brondes, the tourney's fourth seeded player and lost 6-2, 6-1.

Howell and Kiser defeated Jerry Greene and Joe Turek of Start 6-1, 6-2, in the first round before running into the tourney's number one seeded team, Dave Raabs and Jake Reinbolt of Sylvania. The Sylvania twosome won 6-3 and 6-1.

Gary Klos was Ross's other singles player but lost to Mark Bodenmiller of Start 6-3 and 7-5 in the first round.

Werling and Shurmer met Nick Kruse and Randy Zachrich of Napoleon in the second round and dropped 6-2 and 6-1 sets.

Ross's next action will be Monday when Sylvania visits the home of the Little Giants, Rodger Young Park. Match time is 4 p.m.
