District Is Biggest In Ohio:

Trail To State Mat Tourney Begins At Ross Friday At 3

State's biggest district wrestling tournament will be held at Fremont Ross gym Friday and Saturday with athletes from 17 schools vying for the right to travel to Columbus and the state tournament.

Competition will begin with weigh in Friday at 11 a.m. and first match goes off at 3 p.m. Dinner break will be held at 6. Second round action picks up at 7:30 and the first night should be completed by approximately 11. Saturday the semi-finals will start at 3 and the finals at 7.

All wrestlers who reach Saturday's semis will also wrestle in the night program, determining the Nos. 1, 2, 3 and 4 positions.

State tournament will be held the weekend of March 8-9.

Fourteen Area Wrestlers Reach Today's Mat Card

Fourteen area wrestlers survived heavy first day wrestling at Fremont Ross high school Friday afternoon and night in the 17-school district wrestling tournament.

Total of 178 boys began competition for the right to journey to Columbus and the state tournament on March 8-9.

Semi-final round begins today at 3 and finals will be held tonight at 7. There will be 44 boys participating, with four in each class. Those who wrestle in the afternoon session also will battle at night for four positions. Only the champions from each division will make the state tourney.

Sun Devils Eye NCAA Tourney

Arizona State, ranked fourth in the nation and quietly eyeing all the marbles, has stormed past the last major obstacle in its path to the Western Athletic Conference basketball title and a spot in the NCAA western regional tournament.

Coach Ned Wulk's speedy Sun Devils raced past Wyoming 82-72 Friday night and all but nailed down the Conference title and the NCAA spot. The loss eliminated Wyoming from title consideration and left only Brigham Young with an outside chance of catching the team from Tempe.


The victory improved the Sun Devil conference record to 7-1—the only loss a previous upset by Wyoming—with two league games to go. They close out against New Mexico and Arizona, teams the Sun Devils have handled easily earlier this season. A victory in either secures at least a share of the top spot.

The triumph at Tempe took some of the sting out of an 88-81 upset at Wyoming earlier this season and advanced the Sun Devil season record to a sparkling 21-2.



Wind Up Of Big Wrestling District Here:

Ross' Kelly, Haas; Slessman Of Clyde Earn Trip To State

Ross' wrestling demons, Larry Kelly and Glen Haas, and Clyde's star, Frank Slessman, were the only area matmen who will make the trip to Columbus March 8-9 where the state wrestling championships will be held in St. John's arena.

The local trio survived a hectic two-day wrestling program at Ross high school that opened Friday afternoon with 178 boys vying for the spot in the 18th district championship. Fourteen area lads went into Saturday's semi-finals.

This local group represented Ross, St. Joe, Clyde, Lakota and Port Clinton.

Team victory went to loaded Huron which finished with 93 points. Ross was second with 59. Huron qualified eight matsters for Saturday's meet. Ross had five and Clyde and St. Joe three each.

Team Standings

Following Huron and Ross in team standings were Mansfield Madison, 47; Clyde, 44; Ashland, 36; Vermillion, 31; Fostoria, 25; Mansfield Senior, 25; St. Joe, 20; Arcadia, 18; Lakota, 14; Mohawk, 8; Castalia-Margareta, 7; Port Clinton, 7; Sandusky 7; Milan 3; and Ontario, none.

Seventeen schools grouped to make this the largest district in Ohio.

Kelly battled his way to state by winning in the 172-pound class. The Ross senior now has won 18 in a row this season and has not been defeated in dual competition in three years. Slessman also in unbeaten this year and earned the trip by winning in the 175-pound division. Haas distinguished

himself as the only wrestler out of 178 to win all four matches by pins. He won in the 138-pound class.

Kelly defeated Ron Weissenberger of Huron, one of the top-seeded wrestlers in the tournament, by the score of 9-0. Weissenberger earlier had edged St. Joe's Lee Potter in overtime.

Slessman defeated Glen Farm-

er of Arcadia, 5-0, and Haas pinned Bob Vargas of Clyde in 1:29 of the second round.
