Ross third in GLL golf

TEMPERANCE, Mich. — Oregon Clay won the tournament, but Bedford won the Great Lakes League golf crown Tuesday.

Playing at chilly, wind swept Giant Oak Golf Club, the Eagles carded a 337, a stroke better than Bedford.

Fremont Ross used a fifth-man tiebreaker to finish third with 346. Whitmer also had a 346, while Napoleon was fifth with 349., Fostoria sixth with 372 and Sylvania Northview last with 373.

"We just played poorly," Ross coach Dave Fleming said. "I don't know whether it was the wind, cold or what, we just played poorly."

The final league standings are determined by a combination of head-to-head competition and finishes in the tournament. Teams receive two points for each match win with tournament points awarded on a 21, 18, 15, 12, 9, 6, 3 basis.

Bedford had 28 points to win the league title with Clay next at 27. Ross was third with 23.

Mike Nagy of Bedord took medalist honors with a six-over-par 78 on the 6,194-yard layout. Brent Schacht of Clay was the only other player to break 80 with a 79.

Nagy and Schacht, along with Rob Randall of Ross, Wynn Martin of Whitmer and Brian Gerken of Napoleon earned first-team, all-league.

Randall shot 40-41—81 to pace Ross. Dan Grossman and Rob Hammer shot 88s with Eric Brough carding an 89.

Ross took third when the Little Giants' Jon Kingsborough, shot a 90, two strokes lower than Whitmer fifth man Brian Dick.
