The Fremont Ross boys soccer team wasted no time making a statement in their 2025 season opener, rolling past rival Sandusky in dominant fashion Friday night at Don Paul Stadium. Playing in this year's edition of Friday Night Futbol, the Little Giants controlled every aspect of the match on their way to a 9-0 victory.
