ROSS'S OLIVIA HENRY TAKES DECISIVE POINT

With sunlight quickly fading and the fate of Wednesday's match on the swing of every racket, Olivia Henry of Fremont Ross came through in the clutch in the Little Giants' 3-2 non-conference victory over St. Joseph Central Catholic.

Henry and the Crimson Streaks' Allie Barrett, who didn't feel well, battled for over two-and-a-half hours, with some of the rallies reaching 70 or more strokes, according to Ross coach Lisa Wolfe. Henry outlasted Barrett 6-4, 6-4 for the decisive point in the match.

"That could wear somebody out but Olivia was very determined to win that match," Wolfe said. "She stayed focused the whole time and (Barrett) is a pusher and she gets everything back. We had to become the pusher also."

SJCC coach Sam Lagrou-King wondered how the match would've went if Barrett wasn't sick.

"She came to school late and came just so she could play," Lagrou-King said. "That's just the way she is about her sportsmanship and being a leader."

Gillian Gallagher picked up a win at first singles for the Little Giants (9-5) over Morgan Collins, 6-1, 7-5. The other win for Ross came at first doubles where Lily Abdo and Kaity Kelly topped Sophie Militello and Gianna Cullen 6-0, 6-2.

"I'm very proud if my girls," Wolfe said. "No. 1 singles is always tough and it was nice to see Gillian stay focused and do her job."

The Crimson Streaks (9-4) got a win at third singles from Lauren Klaege, as she knocked off Alyssa Meyer 6-2, 6-1. At second doubles for SJCC, the team of Audra Zetzer and Briggs Wonderly defeated Malory Hutton and Natalie Brown 7-5, 6-1.

"What stood out to me first was my second doubles was down 5-2 in the first set and I walked away for about 20 minutes," Lagrou-King said. "I came back and they were up in the set. I kind of already had it in my head they weren't going to win the set. They pulled it out and pulled out the match and I was impressed."

"This is one of the strongest tennis teams St. Joe has ever had. The girls work together and they're a great group of girls -- academically and on the court. They rally around each other."

Wolfe noted that the Fremont rivalry is one for all to enjoy.

"We always have fun facing St. Joe because it's a Fremont team and the girls know each other," Wolfe said. "Sam was one of mine that I coached so it's great to see her have her own team and compete the way they did. She's done a fabulous job."
