Opening District Wrestling Matches For Ross, St. Joe Clyde High Grapplers Listed

Fourteen teams will compete in the Fremont District wrestling tournament scheduled Friday, February 19 and Saturday, February 20 in the Girls' gym, Fremont Junior high school. More than 140 boys will be in action.

Schools participating include defending champion Fremont Ross, Fremont St. Joseph, Clyde, Fostoria, Bowling Green, Mansfield Public, Huron, Sandusky, Mansfield Madison, Napoleon, Ashland, Castalia, Margaretta, Vermilion and Defiance.

Winner and runnerup in each weight class (103 pound, 112, 120, 127, 133, 138, 145, 154, 165, 175 and heavyweight) will advance to the state wrestling meet scheduled in Columbus March 4-5.

Opening round matches will start at 2 p.m. Friday with quarterfinals to begin at 7 Friday night. Semifinals will begin at 3 p.m. Saturday with the finals listed at 7:30 Saturday night. Three mats will be used on opening day.

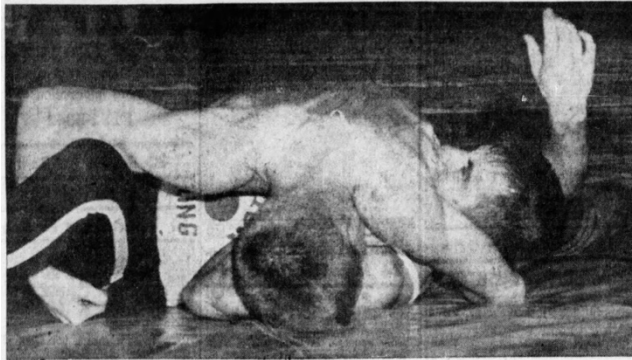

Michigan State Seeks Upset Of Buckeyes

Michigan State, the Big Ten's same duck basketball champion, will see what it can do today in laying Ohio State's rush for the championship.

The Spartans (5-5) have been eliminated from the race but they would like nothing better than to lump Ohio State's hopes of going through the campaign undefeated.

The Buckeyes have won 10 consecutive games including a 111-79 triumph over Michigan State in Columbus. It was the worst basketball loss in MSU history.

The Spartans will have little going for them aside from the home floor advantage—something which has failed to bother Ohio State.

The Buckeyes ripped Illinois at Illinois 109-81 Monday and the Illini hadn't previously lost at home this season.

Ohio State could clinch the title today if they defeat Michigan State and Indiana should lose at Iowa. The Hoosiers (6-3) are the only team with less than four losses.

Even if Indiana should win, Ohio State would clinch a tie for the crown by defeating Michigan State after the MSU game, Ohio State's home to Wisconsin next Saturday before winding up the campaign at Indiana Feb. 29 and at Minnesota March 5.

Other games today find Illinois (5-4) at Wisconsin (1-8), Purdue (5-5) at Northwestern (5-4), and Michigan (0-9) at Minnesota (7-4) in a regionally televised matinee.

Huron Team Champ; Clyde Sends Four Boys To State, Ross Three, SJ One

Huron dethroned Fremont Ross as team champion in the 1960 Northwestern District Sectional wrestling tournament held in the Girls' gym, Fremont Junior high school over the weekend. Gym was well packed with viewers each session.

The Tigers scored 73 points to take first place, Coach Vic De-Orio's Clyde Filers were runner-up with 66, Sandusky third with 55, then Fremont, Ross 53, Fostoria 51, Bowling Green 26, Mansfield Public 25, Napoleon 18, Defiance 16, Mansfield Madison 14, Fremont St. Joseph 13, Ashland, 9, Vermilion 7 and Castalia Margaretta 5.

Both the winner and runnerup in each weight division qualify for the state wrestling tournament to be held at Columbus March 4-5.

Eight Countians Advance

Eight Sandusky county boys will make the trip to the state finals including four from Clyde, three from Fremont Ross and one from St. Joseph high.

Ross sends district winners Ruben Rendon, 133 pounds; Neil Fausey, 138, and Jim Mooney, 120. Clyde sends district champs Cliff Perrin, 154, Chuck Shaull, 112 and second placers Bernie Walden, 127 and Jeff Pump, 133. St. Joe qualified Tim Weltn, runnerup in the 138-pound division.

Coach Chris Ford's Huron team sends one district champ and two second placers to the state.

Coach Mal Mackey's Ross wrestlers won the district last year with Huron finishing second. This was the first year of wrestling competition for Coach Joe Kuzma's St. Joe Strikers.
