Ross again scored in bunches, making two runs in the second inning to tie the score and scoring four times in the third to post the final tally.

# Fremont One Game Away From Buckeye Crown

Fremont Ross' baseball team moved to within one victory Tuesday of the Buckeye Conference title with a 3-1 triumph over a good Lorain Senior club in Lorain. Fremont must play Marion for the championship.

The Buckeye Conference play-off was started several weeks ago and interrupted by the Class 'AA' sectional, district and regional tournaments. Both Ross and Lorain were finalists in their region. The Little Giants own a 3-2 tournament victory over Marion.

Undefeated Ned Peddicord won his sixth game of the campaign with a neat three-hitter over the Steelmen. Russ Hagerty led a six-hit Ross attack.

Ross broke on top in the second with a tally after Jerry Binder doubled, took third on a fielder's choice and scored on Bob Sanford's sacrifice fly. Lorain tied the score in the third with an unearned run.

Fremont won it with a run in the sixth when Hagerty singled, took second on an error and came home on Rick Gabel's single. Fremont's third run scored on two walks and Ken Pasch's single.

Lorain threatened in the seventh with two runners aboard and none out, but Peddicord got two of the next three batters on strikes. Peddicord has allowed just three earned runs in his last five games. He has 60 strike outs this season.
