Ross high's Little Giant cross country team Wednesday was scheduled to meet the harriers of Toledo Libbey in a dual contest at Harmon field.

Coach Whitey Althoff's Purple thinclads, fresh from a close 29 to 26 victory over DeVilbiss last Saturday, were expected to give the Toledo runners a close battle. However, Libbey presents one of the strongest teams yet encountered by Ross, having dropped only one meet thus far this year, that to Toledo Scott, 1936 state champion.

The meet will serve as a warm-up for the district run at Toledo next Saturday.

The annual all-school cross country run will be held at Harmon field Friday, Coach Whitey Althoff, Ross high coach, announced Monday.

Althoff also revealed the last meet of the season would be held against Lima Central between halves of the Tiffin Junior Order Home-Little Giant game November 6. Only under-classmen will be used by both teams in this dual.

The Purple harrier coach said he was well satisfied with his team's showing in the district meet at Toledo last Saturday when Fremont placed fourth in a field of eleven teams. In scoring 146 points and finishing behind such string teams as Scott, Libbey and Waite, the Little Giants runners defeated Mansfield, which team had broken the string of 10 consecutive Fremont victories in a dual meet earlier in the season.
