The play was based on points allotted for each hole won from the opposition and the score sheet shows that Walter Wennis, Bob Johnson and Lionel Lawrence, with two and one half points apiece, were high for Fremont. Other Fremont players and their cards turned in were: Clyde Potter, one point; Eddie Meilke, no count; Gerhardt Neils, one point.

The Napoleon team was composed of Messrs. Walters, Kelly, Lanzier, Gilliland, Finnerty and Cochran. Lanzier was the high man with a card of three points.

Coach Bob Oldfather accompanied the team to Napoleon.
