Liggins, Lytle, Opelt Qualify For State Track & Field Meet

BOWLING GREEN — A participant's ticket to the 65th Annual Ohio High School State Track Meet was easier for Tom Liggins, Rob Lytle and Jeff Opelt to obtain than the Ross High School records in their specialties Saturday.

Liggins, Lytle and Opelt will represent Ross at Ohio State University after superb showings in the Class AAA District Meet at Bowling Green State University Friday and Saturday.

Liggins will go to Columbus for the second straight year as a shot-put contest. Lytle will participate in the 100-yard dash

for the second consecutive spring while Opelt, a sophomore, makes his maiden appearance in the pole vault.

All three will be shooting for first places, but they'll also be after new Ross High records. That was their goal in the district competition but they fell short.

Liggins, who will close a brilliant high school athletic career Saturday morning, placed second in the district with a put of 55-1 1/4, the best performance of his career.

Liggins needs a put of better than 55-10 in the state competition next week to erase the Ross school record held since 1969 by Dave Rhodes.

"That's my goal — to get the school record," Liggins said.

"Coach Armstrong (Tom, who's in charge of the Ross weight competitors) has been working me extra hard the last couple of weeks.

"We've been working a lot with weights and it's starting to pay off. We'll probably only throw two days next week and work on weights the rest of the time.

"I was going all-out on my last throw today for the record, but the shot slipped down into the palm of my hand as I was letting it go."

Ron Soviar of Toledo St. Francis won the shot for the second consecutive spring with an amazing heave of 60-6 1/2, a new district record. The old mark was 59-2 1/2 set in 1967 by Marty Huff, also of St. Francis.

Lytle, a junior, also had a second place finish. He trailed Toledo Libbey's outstanding sprinter, Bobby Lawson, to the finish line in the century, marking the second time in two years the blond-haired Ross speedster has taken second to the Libbey whiz.

Lytle also qualified for the district meet in the 220, but finished third in the finals behind Lawson and Tim Deuble of Toledo Whitmer.

In the 100, Lawson was clocked in 9.8 which tied the district record held by him and three others, Willard's Chuck Barrison (1968 and 1969) and Sandusky's Lavon Jackson (1969) and Elmer Lippert (1970). Lawson also ran a 9.8 in 1971.

Lytle had a 10.1 clocking against a strong cross wind during the 100 and received a 22.5 for his 220 showing compared to Lawson's 21.7 and 22.1 for Deuble.

"My goal in the 100 was to get a 9.6 — that's what I figured would

beat Lawson," Lytle said. "It's pretty frustrating finishing second to him two straight years, I haven't improved.

"I still don't know what's wrong with me in the 220. I was stuck out in that far lane and didn't really see those two guys (Lawson and Deuble) come up on me, but that's no excuse for losing.

"Ever since we ran in the Marion Night Relays I haven't felt good running the 220. First, I had trouble with my back and now my leg's bothering me. And, I can't figure out why but I don't seem to have any strength left for the final 50 yards.

"I know this — I've got a lot of work to do before we go to Columbus."

If Lytle is to get the record in the 100 this spring, he has to do better than 9.8 on the all weather surface at Ohio State. Steve Parker (1968) and Jim Tiller (1957) share the record.

Opelt already has his name in the record book. He's in a three-way tie at 13-6 with Mike Tooman (1971) and Dan Linder (1969) for the pole vault standard.

"Coach Brant told me today he wants just one name up there (on the Ross record board) after next week," Opelt said after winning Ross' only district crown Saturday. "Coach says there isn't enough room on the board for three names."

Opelt had very little competition for his district ticket. There were only two other competitors in the competition. Opelt won at 13-0. One competitor, Bill Bernheuser of Toledo Rogers went out at 11-6 while Mansfield Malabar's Dan Willard couldn't get past 12-0.

The excellent showings by Liggins, Lytle and Opelt pushed Ross into a third place finish in the team race. Ross totaled 32 points while powerful Sandusky, which qualified seven individuals and a relay team for the state meet, blitzed the field with 94. Libbey was second with 70.

The Little Giants finished third behind the same two teams in 1971.
