Ross boys, girls ready for 1996 season

Practice time has been limited but the Fremont Ross Little Giants boys and girls track teams are hard at work preparing for the season despite that fact.

"The weather has been hard on us," Elder said. "The one good thing about it is that all the teams in our part of the state are in the same boat."

Elder begins his eighth season as the head coach for both the boys and girls teams.

A turnout of 90 boys and girls eliminates last year's lack of depth.

"This should make us better dual meet teams," Elder said. "It give us the opportunity to run a lot of kids so they can gain experience."

The boys lettermen include senior Jeremiah Wagner, who finished 12th at the state meet in the 3200 run last year. Senior Clint Hill returns in the 4x800 relay along with senior Jeremiah Smith and junior Kurt Snyder.

Other lettermen returning are seniors Brandon Willer (shot put and discus), Jason Strayer (hurdles), Justin Conklin (sprints). The junior class, besides Smith and Snyder, includes Shaun Tooman (pole vault) and Harry Liggins (sprints). Sophomore Chris Shull, who lettered as a freshman last season, returns in the

shot put.

Key newcomers are sophomores Rashad Brown in the high jump and Demetrius Simms in the long jump. Junior Johnny Aldrich should add depth to the sprints.

"Our throwers are experienced," Elder said. "Brandon looks good and Shull looks good as well."

The Ross girls, the defending Great Lakes League champions, lose only two athletes from last year's team. Gone are Tori Kille in the sprints and high jump and Carey Gill, who was a member of the 4x800 relay team.

Sophomore distance runner Jami Toeppe, still nursing an injured ankle from basketball, will lead the charge for the girls team.

Other letterwinners back to defend the GLL title are seniors Sarah Williams (800, 4x800 and 4x400) and Tirzah Hale (shot put and discus); juniors Marcy Reinbolt (sprinter), Tonya Elder (hurdler), Shannon Heidelberg (sprints), Alison Kelly (distance) and Michelle Salas (shot put and discus) are the returning sophomore letterwinners.

The Little Giants open their season Tuesday at Bedford, Mich.

The Ross boys swept the shot put, discus and long jump as they ran away from Bedford. Brandon Willer won the shot put with a toss of 49 feet 7 inches and discus (137-4) as Chris Shull and Keith Decker took second and third in both events respectively.

In the long jump Fremont's Kenny Morrisette won with a leap of (20-10) Demetrius Simms was second and Jerry Bates finished third.

Morrisette also captured the 200 meters and was a member of the winning 4x100 relay team. Joining Morrisette on the 4x100 relay was Harry Liggins, Bates and Simms.

Other winners for the boys included Shawn Tooman (pole vault), the 4x800 relay team of Kurt Snyder, Clint Hill, Jeremiah Wagner and Jeremiah Smith, Wagner (1600), Rashad Brown (400), Smith (800) and the 4x400 team of Liggins, Hill, Johnny Aldrich and Smith.

Little Giants finish second at Whitmer

TOLEDO — Fremont Ross finished second in the Whitmer Invitational Track and Field Meet Saturday.

Host Whitmer won the meet with 126 points, three more than Ross.

Toledo St. John's was third with 99 and St. Francis finished fourth with 78. Toledo Start with 52, Sylvania Southview with 48, Sandusky with 36 and Toledo Rogers with 24 points comprised the bottom four teams.

"Again, we finished second to Whitmer," Ross coach John Elder said. His team was in the same spot in last year's invitational.

"But," Elder added, "it was a lot closer this time. We want to use this to build on — we have a lot of room for improvement."

Ross won five events including two field events by the same trio. Brandon Willer, Chris Shull and Keith Decker combined to toss the shot put 133 feet, 8 1/2 inches. They came back to win the discus with a 382-foot effort.

Kurt Snyder, Harry Liggins, Clint Hill and Jon Frampton won the distance medley (800, 200, 400, 1600) in 8:30.4.

Jeremiah Smith won the 800 in 2:02.9 and Jeremiah Wagner won the 3200 in 10:07.8.

The shot put team of Shawn Tooman and Pryde Yost finished second with a combined effort of 22-6. Wagner was second in the 1600 in 4:35.3 while Rashad Brown was runner-up in the 400 in 53.0.

The Ross sprint medley (100, 100, 200, 400) team of Jerry Bates, Demetrius Simms, Brown and Snyder was second in 1:41.5. Bates, Liggins, Simms and Kenny Morrisette were second in the 4x100 in 45.7.

The Little Giants boys and girls teams, along with Findlay, are at Napoleon Tuesday in a Great Lakes League meet.

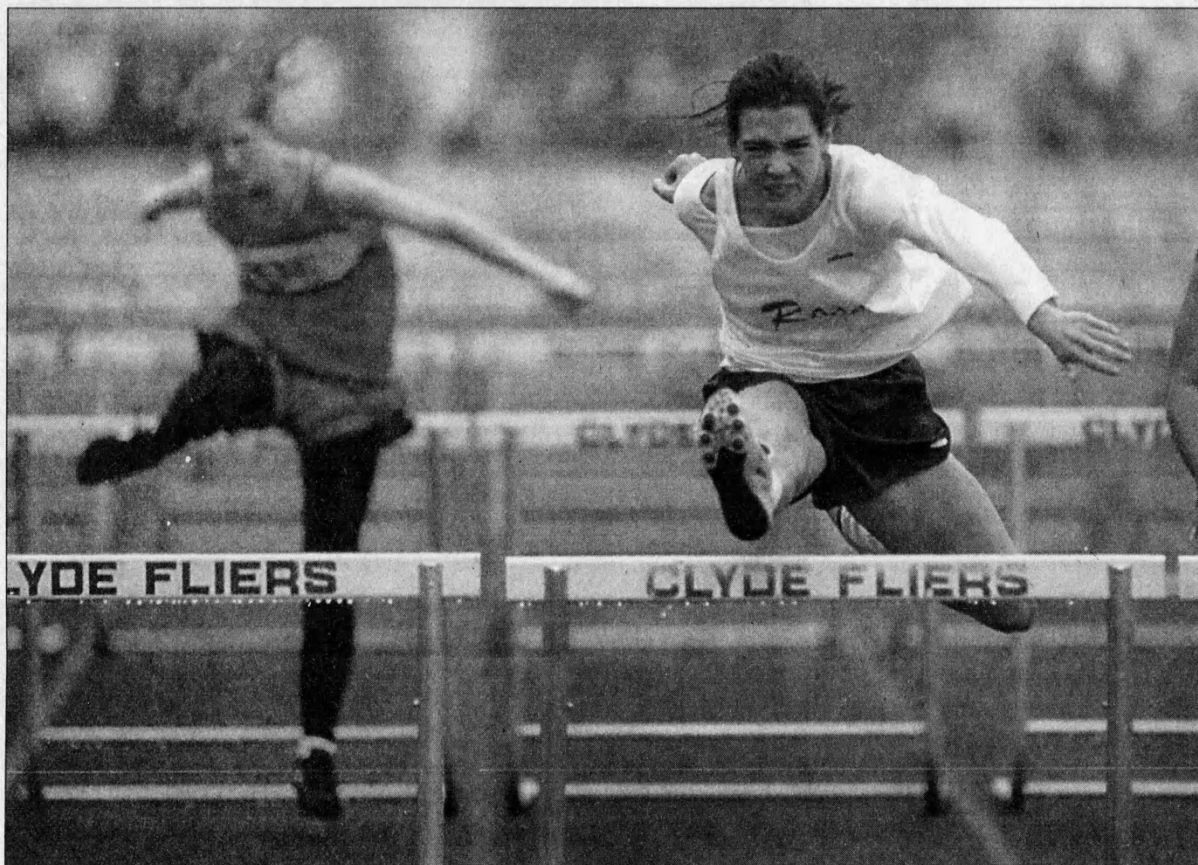

Ross boys win Art Hendricks Invitational

CLYDE — The Ross boys and Toledo Central Catholic girls track teams ran to victories Saturday at the 11th Art Hendricks Invitational.

The Little Giants boys team scored 123 points and Oak Harbor was second with 78. Clyde finished sixth with 38, Woodmore ran eighth with 25 and Margaretta scored 10 points for 11th.

The Woodmore girls were runners-up with 72 points while Ross was third with 62. Margaretta finished fourth with 55, Clyde was seventh with 38 and Oak Harbor ninth with 28.

Brandon Willer, chosen as the

outstanding field event performer, won the shot put and discus for Ross while the long jump duo of Demetrius Simms and Kenny Morrisette finished first and second respectively.

"We knew coming in that if we could score high in the field events we would have a pretty good chance to dominate the meet," Ross coach John Elder said. "I figured we would do that in the shot and discus and was hoping we could do it in the long jump."

Ross also won the 4x800 relay and Rashad Brown captured the 400 meters.

Tirzah Hale took second in the shot put and third in the discus for Ross. Tonya Elder was

second in the 100 hurdles and third in the 300 hurdles. The Ross 4x800 relay team cross the finish line second.

The Oak Harbor boys were led by Josh Osborne who won the high jump and 110 hurdles. Chad Atkinson completed a Rocket sweep in the hurdle events by finishing first in the 300 hurdles.

"We doubled up in the hurdles for 18 quick points and that got us off to a real good start," Oak Harbor coach Tom Osborne said. "I thought our kids, from there on, hung in pretty tough."

The Rocket girls got their best finishes by Anna Noggle who finished first in the Discus and Jennifer Sutkus with a sec-

ond in the 400.

The Woodmore girls captured five firsts as the 4x800 won along with Lindsay Hamilton who took firsts in the 1600 and 3200. Rachel Harder won the 300 hurdles and Angie Michael gave Woodmore a first place in the 800.

Woodmore's Sam Preston had a third place finish in the 100 to pace the Wildcats boys team.

Chad Long led the Clyde boys with a third place finish in the high jump and long jump.

Lisa Keegan, the outstanding field event performer, won the shot put for the Clyde girls and took second in the discus.

Zerman scores 12 in all-star game

WESTERVILLE, Ohio — Helen Darling of Columbus Brookhaven scored 21 points, including a three-point play that gave the South Division I-II all-stars the lead for good in an 85-82 victory Sunday over the North in the annual Ohio North-South all-star games at Otterbein College.

For the North, Meghan Hinds of Toledo Notre Dame had 13 points and Dawn Zerman of Fremont Ross scored 12.

The North won the Division III-IV contest 84-78.

In the Division I-II game, the North led by as many as 11 points early and held a 45-35 halftime advantage. The South came back slowly, never taking the lead until Darling, the Division I player of the year, was fouled while hitting a layup with 3:05 remaining. Her free throw put the South up 81-79 and her team never trailed again.

She had 13 of her team's final 16 points.
