Fremont Ross boys (70.50 points) won the Divi-

sion I district meet at Tiffin Columbian on Friday. The girls placed third (81.50) while Celina (86.50) took first. Top four placers advance to regionals.

Fremont Ross boys top four placers include, Elijah Jonson, first in the 110 hurdles (14.95); Tyler Grine, third in the 100 dash (11.33); 200 relay placed second (1:29.52); 100 relay placed second (42.99); Jaylen Spencer, third in the 400 dash (50.86); Jared Fox, fourth in the 400 dash (50.99); 400 relay placed first (3:21.99); and Tyler Schell, second in the pole vault (13-09.00).

On the girls side, 100 relay placed third (51.23); Cassidi Lovell, second in the 800 run (2:23.95); Vanashia Elkins, second in the 300 dash (26.24); Matallyn Overmyer, first in the discus (114-08); Olivia DeRodes, fourth in the high jump (4-10.00); Dejasha Pettiford, first in the long jump (16-10.25); Amber Otermat, first in the pole vault (12-00.00); and AnneMarie Moses, second in the pole vault (11-06.00).

Fremont Ross moves forward

Elijah Johnson won the 110 hurdles (14.95) and Oliver Ellis, Jaylen Spencer, Jared Fox and Jalen Sims won the 4x400 relay (3:21.99) as the Fremont Ross boys track team finished first at Division I districts.

"I was shocked because we beat Bowling Green by half a point," Spencer said of the crown. "It's very special to me that the boys won districts because Ross (hadn't) won districts since my brother's (James Aaron Spencer) senior year (2010)."

Tyler Schell was second in the pole vault (13-9), Spencer was third in the 400 (50.86) and Fox was fourth (50.99) and Tyler Grine was third in the 100 (11.33). Johnson, Sims, Spencer and Grine were second in the 4x100 (42.99) and Spencer, Tavarious Simms, Sims and Grine were second in the 4x200 (1:29.52).

"I was a bit nervous because I haven't ran (in the 4x100) since my freshman year," Spencer said. "When I ran the 400 I had a goal to place in the top four and beat Davion Fisher (Sandusky) and (earn) a spot in regionals. Coaches moved me to first-leg

from anchor in the 4x200 because I had a strong block start to get us in a lead.

Matallyn Overmyer won the discus (114-8), Amber Otermat the pole vault (12-0) and Dejsha Pettiford the long jump (16-10.25) as the Little Giants' girls were third. Olivia DeRodes was fourth in the high jump (4-10).

Cassidi Lovell was second in the 800 (2:23.95), Imani Elkins, Jazzele Lindsey, Vanashia Elkins and Pettiford were third in the 4x100 (51.23) and Vanashia Elkins was second in the 200 (26.24). AnneMarie Moses was second in the pole vault (11-6).

Athena Eli, Emma Barney, Alexa Weis and Abby Dornbusch won the 4x100 (50.35) and 4x200 (1:45.31) as Oak Harbor's girls were third at districts. Dornbusch has picked up a new nickname - Anchor Abby.
