

Ross wins BC division title

Ross rolled to the Buckeye Conference Western Division title Tuesday, sweeping Marion Harding 2-1 in both games of an afternoon twinbill.

John Rios hurled a three-hitter and Brian Farr's base hit in the fourth inning drove in the winning run in the first game. Tom Pena and Brian Humbarger combined to pitch the Little Giants to the second game win as the Little Giants scored both run in the sixth inning.

In other games in the area, Genoa tossed a wrench into Lakota's Suburban Lakes League hopes, defeating the Raiders 5-4 and Woodmore got past Gibsonburg 7-3.

Rios struckout six and walked one for Ross in the first game. He had one hit (Ross had four off losing pitcher Pat Hughes) and scored a run. Jay Bowers was one for three and scored on Farr's high in the fourth.

Harding's run was in the fifth.

Mark Hulka was three for three, sophomore Jim Hufford three for four and Dave Eicher had two hits to pace Ross's 10-hit second game attack.

Hufford drove in Ross's winning run in the two-run sixth. Harding had scored in the fourth.

Pena pitched five innings, giving up the run, walking two, and giving up six hits. Humbarger allowed only a hit in the final two innings for the save.

Ross finished 6-0 in the Division and will probably share the Buckeye Conference Crown with Elyria, winners of the Eastern Division with a 6-0 mark. No BC playoffs is scheduled. The Little Giants finished the season with a 16-4 mark under first year Coach

Ray Castilleja drove in two runs including the game winner in the bottom of the fifth for Genoa. The Raiders had tied the game in the top of the inning on Tom Sprow's single, stolen base, Chris Chalfin's sacrifice and Larry Ray's groundout to first.

Genoa scored single runs in the first and second and added two in the third. A double by Ron Lowe, Laurence St. John's RBI single, a fielder's choice and a walk followed by Ron Keathon's single produced the two runs in the third for the Comets.

In the Lakota second, Kevin Tiell and Jim Bickel stoked back-to-back doubles for a run. A stolen base and an error scored the second run.

A five-run third inning propelled the Wildcats to the win over the Golden Bears. Winning pitcher Scott Sandwisch homered and drove in three runs.

Dana Busdeker was two for three with a pair of RBI and Jeff Perkins had two hits for Woodmore. Tom Rowan had two RBI.

For Gibsonburg, Andy Kohler doubled and singled and Jamie Sticker had two hits.

Woodmore is 11-9 while Gibsonburg is 9-11-1.
