

Andrews wins GLL title

SYLVANIA — Fremont Ross freshman Adam Andrews won the Great Lakes League first-court singles championship Tuesday, while too many unforced errors kept the Little Giants from finishing any higher than fourth in the league championship race.

Andrews defeated Marc Schlachter of Bedford (Mich.) 6-2, 6-3 after knocking off Northview's Hoshi Sakamoto 6-3, 6-0 in the semifinals at the Courts of Sylvania Tennis Club.

"Today, Adam did what he had to do to win," Ross coach Craig Kachmarik said. "For a freshman to show that kind of poise, knowing what he has to do to win, shows a lot about his ma-

turity. He has an awful lot of confidence in his game."

"He was definitely the rose among the thorns."

Andrews is 14-1 this season.

Toledo Whitmer won the league title with 31 points. The Panthers added 21 points for winning the tournament to the 10 they amassed for their five wins during the dual season.

Points were awarded to individuals or doubles teams based on places one through six in the tournament. The rank after that scoring procedure determined the tournament finish and ultimately the GLL champion.

Ross had 16 points in tournament finishes, which earned it 12 tournament team points. The Little Giants had eight points entering the tournament based on four dual victories.

"We needed to win a couple other matches here and there," Kachmarik said.

Napoleon was second followed

by Oregon Clay, Ross, Northview, Bedford and Fostoria.

The top-seeded first-court doubles team Brian Stein and Greg Byrnes of Ross had a first-round bye then defeated a team from Bedford 6-1, 6-2 in the semifinals before losing to Whitmer's Axel Kimmich and Marc Schlachter 6-2, 7-6 (7-3) in the finals.

"I was very happy with Greg and Brian," Kachmarik said. "They were an excellent doubles team all year."

"Errors cost us against Whitmer. The inability to keep the ball in play. It wasn't their winners as much as our errors."

Aleks Ripple and T.J. Wolfe defeated a team from Fostoria 6-2, 6-1 in the first round then lost to Clay's top-seeded second doubles team of Fred Fick and Casey Slovak 3-6, 6-3, 6-4.

"We won the first set, and again errors started creeping back in," Kachmarik said. "They couldn't close the match."

Toledo Whitmer dominates GLL

FOSTORIA — Whitmer brought out the broom Tuesday, sweeping up both sides of the Great Lakes League Track and Field Meet.

The Whitmer boys piled up 155 points, while runner-up Fostoria was a distant second with 116. Ross was third with 79.

"This is about where I figured we would finish," Ross coach John Elder said. "We knew we had a shot at second or third but Fostoria had just few too many big guns that we did not have and of course, Whitmer has it all."

The Panther girls pulled ahead

of second-place Napoleon in the final four events to win the girls crown. Whitmer had 140 points, and Napoleon finished with 125.

Napoleon was fourth in the boys meet with 61, followed by Fostoria 67, Bedford 31, Ross 25 and Clay with 13.

In the girls meet, Northview finished third with 106, followed by Fostoria 67, Bedford 31, Ross 25 and Clay with 12.

Tony Franks won the shot put and the discus for the Little Giants and the Ross 4x400 team pulled out a win at the finish line.

Franks sailed the discus 150

feet, 7 inches on his final toss and took the shot with a heave of 50-8 $\frac{3}{4}$.

"He took awhile in the discus," Elder said, "he waited until the last throw to win it which makes it a little unnerving; it wasn't his best, but we will take it."

"We started out a little flat today overall. Toddy (Price) did not have a really good long jump; he ended up jumping fairly well but the Whitmer kid probably had his best jump of the year."

"We had our best pole vaults (Dave Kadlubowski and Melvin Rusch finished fifth and sixth) and they got us some points and after that, we started picking up the pace."

The 4x400 quartet of Mark Sheidler, Jeff Pasch, Preston Eberly and Tyrone Price won in 3:29, a second better than runner-up Whitmer.

Eberly pulled the Little Giants even on the third leg, handing off to Price. The Ross junior slipped to third behind Whitmer and Napoleon before beginning his kick 200 meters from the finish line.

"That was nice," Elder said. "That was our best time all

year."

Eberly was second in the 400 and Pasch took runner-up honors in the 800.

Elder had pulled Pasch from the open 400 and inserted him into the 800.

"We hoped we would get first or second in that event," Elder said.

Eberly continued his good showings in the 400, losing to Fostoria freshman Jermaine Cousin by .2 seconds with his 52.5 clocking.

Lisa Elder won the long jump for the Ross girls, their only first of the day. The freshman cleared 16-3.

Bille Jo Elder was second in the high jump, clearing 4-10.

In other meet highlights, Ahren Jacobs of Whitmer set a meet record in the 100 dash, winning his third GLL title with a 10.87-second effort.

Mark Hiser, a transfer from Lakota to Fostoria, was the meet's only triple winner, taking the high jump and both hurdles races.

Besides Franks, the only other double winner was Whitmer's Jim Bournes in the 1600 and 3200 runs.

Nancy Keeler of Northview was the only girl to win two events, the 1600 and 3200.
