



Ross Swimmers Getting Ready For Busy Season

If Ross high's youthful swimmers improve as much as Coaches Bill Faunce and Jack Balsizer believe they are capable, then watch out! Ross should have a crackjack tank team.

The coaches today pointed out that there are seven lettermen working out, plus a "nice group" of sophomores.

"We are looking for a good year," Head Coach Faunce declared, "providing the boys improve as much as expected."

Ross is taking on the best available, meeting Canton McKinley, the perennial state champion; Lima Senior, second to McKinley last season; Sandusky, rated seventh in the state; Mansfield and Akron Buchtel, tied for the 11th position. All ratings were earned in the state meet at Ohio State university.

The swimmers are hard at work for the opening contest against Findlay in the local pool on January 6, but prior to that date the tank crew has a couple of other engagements, the squad affray at 7:30 December 14, a Thursday, and the alumni event December 21, also at 7:30.

CLEVELAND (AP)—The Cleveland Browns will go against the New York Giants in Yankee Stadium Sunday afternoon with the National Football League's leading passer and top ground gainer.

Quarterback Milt Plum, passing king last year, leads the flingers in percentage of passes completed at 61.4 and with the lowest percentage of interceptions, 3.2.

Fullback Jim Brown holds a 77-yard lead in his race with Green Bay's Jim Taylor for his fifth straight rushing crown. Brown has gained 1,306 yards in 281 carries for an average of 4.6 yards per carry. He picked up six yards in the league statistics Wednesday when a recheck of official scoring records showed he gained 62 yards instead of 56 against the Chicago Bears last Sunday.

Plum and Brown say they gladly would forego the individual honors to have the Browns still in the title race. They were knocked out of contention for the NFL's eastern division title by their 17-14 loss to the Bears.

Ross High Tank Team Opens With Findlay

Ross high's swimming team officially opens its regular season Saturday with a 2:30 p.m. dual with Findlay at the Junior High pool.

Coach Bill Faunce's tankmen earlier warmed up their season with an intra-squad affair and an alumni meet. Faunce, who feels this squad has fine potential, was pleased with results shown in those early tests. He was particularly pleased with the showing of Bill Knoke, who along with Bob Cliburn, will serve as team co-captain for this season.

Against the alumni, Knoke broke the school record in the 100-yard breast stroke previously held by Lynn Huffman. Knoke, who swam against Huffman in the record-breaking performance, came home in 1:12.9, a second faster than Huffman's time in the 1959-60 campaign.

Findlay, also opening its season, is coached by Jim Repp, who gave birth to swimming at the Trojan

school in 1957 after it was discontinued in 1946. Last season was the only time a Repp-coached team defeated Ross in the water. Ross, however, came back to win the second time around.

Faunce said the Trojans are reportedly strong in the diving, breast stroke, butterfly, 50-yard free style and backstroke events.

Ross Edges Findlay In Dual Tank Meet

Coach Bill Faunce's 1962 Ross swimming team successfully opened its season Saturday afternoon at the junior high pool with a narrow 44½ to 41½ victory over up and coming Findlay.

Three new school records were set, and one falling for the first time since 1939. Jim Parker eclipsed Benny Hayes' old mark in the 100-yard butterfly when he came home in 1:05.1. The old mark was 1:05.2.

Bill Knoke, who two weeks ago broke the 100-yard breast stroke record, did it again with a 1:12.5 effort. Knoke's previous best was 1:12.9.

Jack Jaisler, who earlier this season was laid-up with a broken arm, broke the third record when he finished the 200-yard Individual medley in 2:32.8. The old record of 2:34.6 was established last year by Dave Parker at 2:34.6.

Ross went into the relays with a 41-31 lead but a sweep by Findlay would have cost the Giants a victory. In the relays a team is either given a total of seven points or none for each race. Ross lost the first relay, the 200-yard medley, but gained a tie in the 200-yard free style relay and split the points.

The next swim meet is here on January 18 with Sandusky.

Ross Tankers Meet Sandusky Thursday

Ross high swimming team hosts Sandusky Thursday at 7:30 p.m. as the Little Giants shoot for win win No. 2. Last week, the Fremonters defeated Findlay in a close dual.

Sandusky has participated in two previous meets, losing to Upper Arlington 56 - 39 and bowing to Kent State high 60-26. Upper Arlington earlier knocked off Canton McKinley, defending Ohio champ five times running.

Ross and Sandusky first started competing in swimming back in 1934 when the water sport was started in Fremont. Since that time Ross has taken 29 of the 44 duals.

Streak stars are Tim Sidley, a senior, and Bill Zorn, a junior. Sidley holds the Sandusky record in the 100 - yard breast stroke at 1:10.6 and he should hook up with Bill Knoke in the feature race of the night. Knoke is a recent record-breaker for Ross at 1:12.5 but coach Bill Faunce believes he is capable of doing much better.

Sandusky, basically a junior team, finished fifth in the state meet last season, and Faunce feels this meet will be the first big test for Ross.

Final Event Sinks Ross Swimmers 44-42 In Sandusky Meet

Ross high swimmers last night had to win both relay events in order to pull out a tank dual with Sandusky. The Little Giants, behind the brilliant work of Tom Lloyd, completed the first half of the leg in the 200-yard medley but faltered in the final 200-yard free style and bowed 44-42.

Ross trailed 37-35 going into the final two events.

Ross also missed a chance at gaining more points when a tough and bruised diver, Bob Lozano, struck the diving board twice and lost valuable points. He did come back, however, to pile up enough points to miss second place by a tenth of a point. The diving victory went to Sandusky's Steve Springer.

The Streaks' Bill Zorn set two pool records, one in the 100-yard butterfly with a time of 58.5 and another in the 200-yard individual medley with a time of 2:22.0. Tim Loehr of Canton had held the pool mark in the butterfly event with a 59.3, set in 1960. The second mark was previously held by Marty Shenk of Lima at 2:27.6 in 1960.

Fremont's Jim Porker also bettered records in the butterfly and individual medley but because it is a tradition in Fremont that a swimmer must win his event the record is not recognized.

Three Tie In Crosby Golf Open

PEBBLE BEACH, Calif. (AP)—Anything can happen and probably will today in the second round of Bing Crosby's \$50,000 golf tournament as the huge field chases two youngsters and a sharp-shooting old timer.

Former national collegiate champions Joe Campbell and Phil Rodgers had the lead to themselves at 67 until Chuck Congdon, 52, came along to equal it and wrap the first round of this 72-hole event in a three-way deadlock.

All three fired over the Monterey Peninsula Country Club course. Today they tee off at Pebble Beach, a layout considered two to three strokes tougher.

Rodgers of San Diego, the 1958 NCAA champ while at the University of Houston, continued the spectacular golf that won him the Los Angeles Open by nine strokes two weeks ago. Campbell, the collegiate titlist at Purdue in 1955, fired five birdies in the final nine holes to put himself on the top rung.

Then Congdon, of Tacoma, Wash., who was playing tournament golf before the other co-leaders were born, blazed in with his 67 that included birdie putts of 40, 20 and 18 feet.

Western Reserve Academy Saturday night won the final event, the 200-yard free style relay, and gained a tie with Ross high in a dual swimming meet at the academy.

The meet was close down to the final two relays and Ross forged ahead by seven points when Jack Jaisler, Bill Knoke, Jim Parker and Tom Lloyd set a new school record in the 200-yard medley relay with a time of 1:51.9. The old mark was set in 1960 when Jack Talbot, Lynn Huffman, Bob Vogel and Slessman finished in a time of 1:53.6.

Western Reserve finished the 200-yard free style .07 of a second faster than Ross to gain the tie. Ross at one time midway
