Moran has high expectations for Ross swimmers

Experience-wise, Fremont Ross's boys and girls swimming teams will have varying amounts this season. Still, coach Phil Moran has equally high expectations for both.

The boys team has eight upperclassmen, while the girls will rely heavily on a group of 10 incoming freshmen.

Moran said the boys team is probably the best boys squad team he has had during his five-year tenure.

"I have high expectations," Moran said. "We have the

potential to knock off some school records that have been around for 12 or 15 years."

Senior Brett Spicer will swim in the 200 and 500 meter races, senior Pryde Yost will participate in the 50 and 100 meter races and senior Josh Tooman will swim the backstroke. The Little Giants will also have senior Aron Ozsald, a foreign exchange student from Hungary, who will swim the freestyle.

John Oliver, another senior, will compete in the diving events. The Little Giants lost state-qualifying divers Ryan

Newman and Kyle Fisher to graduation.

"Those were points that we used to count on," Moran said. "John has stepped it up and switched to diving to help us out. He's doing pretty well."

Ross also has a "good group of juniors," Moran said, led by Josh Fate, who can do just about anything. Other juniors include Buck Young, a freestyle and backstroke swimmer, J.J. Glaspy, a distance freestyler and Matt Clark, a steadily improving freestyler.

Several sophomores will also be expected to step it up in the

freestyle events: Danny Schrickel, Dave Moore, Adam Bundschuh, Seth Geib and Brent Tooman. Freshmen Paul Nalley and Mervin Forbes will also contribute heavily to Moran's team.

Despite losing five-time all-American Molly O'Connor, Moran feels his girls team will be better in dual meets.

"I'm pretty excited," Moran said. "I think everyone will have to step it up. It will be more of a team concept. We relied a lot on Molly last year."

Senior Jenny Schaaf will swim the sprint freestyle, senior Nicole Farrell is an "all-around good swimmer", according to Moran, and Amy Barnes, a transfer from South Carolina, will provide speed in distance freestyle races.

Juniors Courtney Abbott, Rachel Rush and Beth Hoelzle will swim the freestyle, and Abby Cominsky will participate in the freestyle and breaststroke.

Junior Jenny Straight and sophomore Nicki Straight will handle the diving for the girls team.

Six sophomores will also be counted on quite a bit. Meg Nalley will swim the freestyle, Sarah Cochey and Erin Weatherby will participate in the breaststroke, Kristen Sachs will swim the backstroke, Noelle Stroempl, a transfer from Port Clinton, will compete in the freestyle and backstroke.

Morgan O'Connor, Molly's sister, leads the group of freshmen. Sarah Berger, Kristen Van Dyne, Tia Gilson, Anna Obregon, Sam Glasby, Nicki Straight, Erika Parker, Rachel Sachs and Amber Barnes will also see plenty of action.

Ross girls third at NWOAC relays

Little Giant boys finish fourth

NAPOLEON — The Fremont Ross girls swimming team got seven top-5 finishes to place third at the NWOAC relays on Saturday.

Host Napoleon won the event, Notre Dame finished second and Sylvania Northview finished fourth. Oak Harbor finished seventh.

SWIMMING

The finish was the best ever for the Ross girls at the meet, and the first time in team history that the Little Giants have beaten Northview. The team made 8-of-9 goal times in what coach Phil Moran called a "good start."

High finishers for the Little Giants were Amy Barnes, second in the 500 freestyle in 5:31, and the 200 freestyle relay team of Barnes, Beth Hoelzle, Courtney Abbott and Jenny Schaaf, second in 1:49.73.

Third place Ross finishers were divers Jenny Straight and Rachel Rusch, the 800 freestyle relay team of Tia Gilson, Nicole Farrell, Morgan O'Connor and Barnes, and the 400 freestyle relay team of Abbott, Hoelzle, Gilson and Schaaf.

The 400 medley relay team of O'Connor, Farrell, Abbott and Sarah Berger finished fourth, and the 300 breaststroke relay team of Abby Cominsky, Sarah Coche, Erin Weatherby and Sam Glaspy finished fifth.

The Ross boys team also got off to a solid start at the relays, finishing fourth behind Napoleon, Sandusky Perkins and Northview. The Little Giants got five top-5 finishes, and hit 6-of-9 goal times.

Two relay teams finished second for the boys, the 800 freestyle team of Josh Fate, Brett Spicer, Buck Young and Pryde Yost, and the 200 freestyle team of Yost, Spicer, Fate and Dan Schrickel. The 300 freestyle team of J.J. Glaspy, Josh Tooman, Jon Oliver and Aron Ozsvald finished third.

Also, the 300 medley team of Fate, Yost and Buck Young placed fourth, and the 400 medley team of Young, Glaspy, Ozsvald and Schrickel was fifth.

Ross hosts Tiffin Columbian on Tuesday.

Little Giants sweep Columbian

Fremont Ross swimmer Brett Spicer said that one of the Little Giants' team goals this season was to finish with a perfect record in dual meets.

The Ross boys and girls swimming teams both won their meets with Tiffin Columbian at Fremont Middle School on Tuesday, and now have one less meet to worry about.

The Little Giants boys beat the Tornadoes 79-13, winning all 11 events, while the girls won 63-31, winning 9 of 11 events.

"We're hoping to go undefeated," Spicer said. "We have two or three tough meets, but I think all of our guys and our girls can both rise to the occasion, and we can beat some of the best people in the state."

Spicer placed first in the 100 butterfly with a time of 1:03.68. Spicer also was part of the first place finishes of the 400 freestyle relay and 200 medley relay.

Matt Clark, Josh Fate and Buck Young were the other members of the 400 freestyle team, which finished in 3:57.96.

In the girls 200 medley relay, Amy Barnes, Nicole Farrell, Morgan O'Connor and Jenny Schaaf took first place with a time of 2:04.81.

"I felt that I swam good for this meet," Farrell said.

Farrell, who also finished second in the 100 butterfly and first in the 100 breaststroke, said she has high hopes for her team.

"As a team we have a lot of depth," said Farrell. "Hopefully we can have a really successful season in dual meets and place well in districts."

Ross coach Phil Moran is also optimistic about this year.

"I'm pretty excited," said Moran. "We have not had this strong of team since I've been here, in terms of depth."

"That is going to keep us in a lot of meets this year. We haven't done too well in dual meets over the past couple of years."

Ross, which lost to Columbian last year in a dual meet, received some motivation from Moran.

"I put a lot of pressure on the younger kids," Moran said. "I told them we got beat last year, we don't want to get beat this year, so we better step it up a bit."

Moran, who swam some of his younger swimmers to give them some experience, said his team responded well.

"They really stepped it up and did a nice job," he said.

Columbian coach Ben Lusk said that he was pleased with his teams' performances, despite the losses.

"I think we did excellent for our first

meet," Lusk said. "We had a lot of seniors graduate last year. It was a great way to get to know a lot of our swimmers."

Moran said he was happy with the performance of Courtney Abbott.

"She has been trying to break a minute (100 freestyle) for quite a while now," Moran said. "She finally did it today."

"She put her head down the last 15 yards or so, and she did it by a couple of tenths. We were pretty excited for her."

Abbott finished in 59.83 seconds, placing first in the event. Abbott was also part of the 400 freestyle relay which placed first and the winning 200 freestyle relay.

Barnes, O'Connor and Schaaf were also on the 400 freestyle relay team which finished with a time of 4:03.46.

Another factor working in the Giants' favor was the support of both swimmers

and fans at Fremont Middle School.

"I think everybody swam real well today and a lot of people were cheering," said Spicer. "That's one thing that hasn't happened in previous years."

"Some people just worry about themselves, but everybody is cheering for each other this year, and that's really good."

Moran also praised the fan support.

"You don't need a lot of people to fill this place, but we had it jam-packed," said Moran. "It was nice to have a big crowd."

Ross competes once more at home this season, against Sandusky on Jan. 12. The teams' next competition is Saturday at Sylvania Northview.

And coach Moran, what about that undefeated season?

"It's realistic, but it's going to be tough," he said.

Little Giant boys knock off Northview

SYLVANIA — The Fremont Ross boys swimming team recorded its first win over Sylvania Northview in over 20 years Saturday, beating the Wildcats 97-86.

"Basically, the current members of this team weren't even born the last time we won against Northview," said Ross coach Phil Moran, whose team improved to 2-0.

The Little Giants got four individual first place finishes, and two relay teams won their races.

Brett Spicer won the 200 freestyle with a time of 2:12.04, Pryde Yost won the 200 individual freestyle in 2:23.61 and 100 freestyle in 57.69, and Buck Young won the 100 backstroke in 1:06.66. The 200 freestyle relay team of Yost, Spicer, Josh Fate and Dan Schrickel won in 1:46.98, and the 400 freestyle relay team of Yost, Spicer, Young and Fate won in 3:59.57.

Recording second place finished for Ross were the 200 medley relay team of Young, Schrickel, Aron Ozsvald and J.J. Glaspy, Schrickel in the 50 freestyle and Fate in the 500 freestyle.

The Ross girls lost a narrow decision to Northview, 91-85.

"We gave it a great run and finished strong," said Moran. "It's the closest we've ever been to them."

Ross wasn't swimming its strongest lineup, as two athletes swam cold after taking the ACT in Fremont. Another swimmer missed the meet with a family engagement.

Amy Barnes was a standout for the Little Giants, winning the 200 freestyle in 2:14.05, the 500 freestyle in 6:08.13 and helping the 100 breaststroke team finish first in 4:27.33. Courtney Abbott, Morgan O'Connor and Sarah Berger were the other members of the 100 breaststroke team.

Abbott also won the 50 freestyle in 29.57.

Second place finishers for Ross included Nicole Farrell in the 100 butterfly, Noelle Stroempl in the 100 backstroke and the 200 freestyle relay team of O'Connor, Abbott, Barnes and Beth Hoelzle.

"The team swam with a lot of heart today, and they made a lot of positive progress," Moran said.

Ross boys win triangular meet

Oak Harbor girls sweep

PORT CLINTON — The Fremont Ross boys swimming team got strong performances from Pryde Yost and several other swimmers to win the Port Clinton Triangular Tuesday, beating Port Clinton 101-74 and Oak Harbor 11-38.

The Ross girls team split on the day, beating Port Clinton 116-66 and losing to Oak Harbor 106-78.

"The boys improved to 4-0, which was kind of expected," said Ross coach Phil Moran. "The girls swam well, and were in the meet with Oak Harbor. We haven't been in the meet for years. Everybody swam pretty well."

Leading the way for the Little Giant boys was the 200 freestyle relay team of Yost, Josh Fate, Dan Schrickel and Brett Spicer, which set a pool record of 1:35.10.

"They were pretty excited about that," said Moran.

Leading the relay team was Yost, who led off with a 22.9 split. Yost also won the 50 freestyle in 22.7, the first two times he had broken the 23-second mark in dual meet competition.

"That's pretty impressive, to do that in one meet," Moran said.

Also recording wins for Ross were Buck Young (200 freestyle), Aron Ozsvald (100 butterfly) and Schrickel (500 freestyle). Jon Oliver (diving), J.J. Glaspy (200 freestyle), Paul Nalley (100 freestyle), Brent Tooman (500 freestyle), Adam Bundschuh (100 backstroke), Schrickel (100 breast-

stroke) and the 400 freestyle relay team all finished second in their events.

Amy Barnes led the Ross girls team, winning the 200 intermediate medley and 500 freestyle. Jenny Straight was also a first-place finisher for Ross, topping the divers with 203.20.

Coming in second for Ross were Courtney Abbott (50 freestyle), 100 freestyle, the 200 freestyle relay team of Abbott, Barnes, Jenny Schaaf and Beth Hoelze, and the 400 freestyle relay team of Abbott, Barnes, Schaaf and Morgan O'Connor.

For Oak Harbor, senior Lindsay Lange set a school record in the 100-yard freestyle, won the 100 breaststroke and swam on two winning relay teams.

Lange took first in the 100 free in 54.63 seconds, breaking Melanie

Hamann's previous school record set in 1994.

Lange teamed with Andrea Lajti, Leanne Ernsthausen and Jackie Baumgartner to win the 200 medley relay.

Lange also anchored the winning 400 free relay team that included Amber Noggle, Francine Darr and Kelly Van Horn.

Kelly Van Horn won the 50 free and 100 butterfly and anchored the Rockets' winning 200 free relay that included Amber Noggle, Lajti and Janelle Montano. Lajti won the 100 backstroke and Francine Darr won the 200 free.

Both teams travel to Cleveland this weekend for the Viking Invitational, featuring the top teams from around the state.

"If you make the finals, you have a good shot at getting to state," Moran said.

Yost fast off the blocks

Swimmer excels in 50, 100 free

Picture a hypothetical swimming meet. Visualize the competitors in the 50- or 100-meter freestyle races getting ready to hit the water.

The swimmers toe the block, focus on the race and listen for the starter's signal.

On your mark. Get set. Go.

If Fremont Ross swimmer Pryde Yost is competing, he is most likely off to an early lead.

"Of all the kids I've ever been around, he's the fastest off of the block that I've seen," said Ross coach Phil Moran.

Yost, The News-Messenger Athlete of the Week, said he was not always interested in swimming.

"I started swim to stay in shape for baseball," he said. "I broke a record that year, so I decided to stay with it."

Moran said Yost's development has been a long, but rewarding process.

"It took a long time to get him built up and ready," said Moran. "So for what he's doing now, it's pretty amazing."

Yost, who is Ross's top swimmer in the 50- and 100-meter freestyle, said he is now ready to focus on a state title.

"Since I'm a senior this year I'd like to do well and make the finals at state," said Yost. "I am pretty sure that I'll be able to qualify for state, but I just want to make the top five at state."

However, Yost is not overly confident in his abilities and is rather modest when talking about his skills.

"Everyone thinks that I am super fast," he said. "I don't think I'm that fast. I just like to have fun."

Moran said if Yost continues to work on the finer aspects of swimming, he can become one of the best in the state.


"He has begun concentrating on his stroke and his timing and his body position," Moran said. "Those are the little things that he never used to do. If he continues to do this, this year, I think he'll be pleasantly surprised."

Moran recalled Yost's performance at the Viking Invitational in Cleveland earlier this year and said the aforementioned "little things" affected Yost's finish at the meet.

"He was winning (the 100 freestyle) by a body length over everybody in the state of Ohio in his heat," said Moran. "He was coming up to 75 (meters) when he tightened up and everybody caught him and he finished eighth."

Yost has made many adjustments to his daily routine to prepare for competition, and said they can become strenuous at times.

"I get up at 5 (a.m.)," he said. "We start

practice at 5:45 and go to 7 (o'clock).

"Sometimes we have lifting to 4:30 after school, and we don't get out of (practice) until 7:30."

But for Yost to be competitive at the state

level, Moran said these changes must take place. Moran also said that Yost must develop more physically and become mentally confident.

"His 100 (freestyle) is still questionable," said Moran. "It's just a matter of attitude and preparation."

In the future, Yost said he hopes swimming will provide an opportunity for him in college.

"This will probably be my way into college if I keep my grades up," he said. "I would like to go to Cincinnati since they have a good baseball program."

But before Yost can leave for college, Moran said he would like to see him leave his name in the record books.

"He's got the potential to break some records this year," said Moran.


Beth Hoelzle said beating the Streaks is also important for the girls team.
