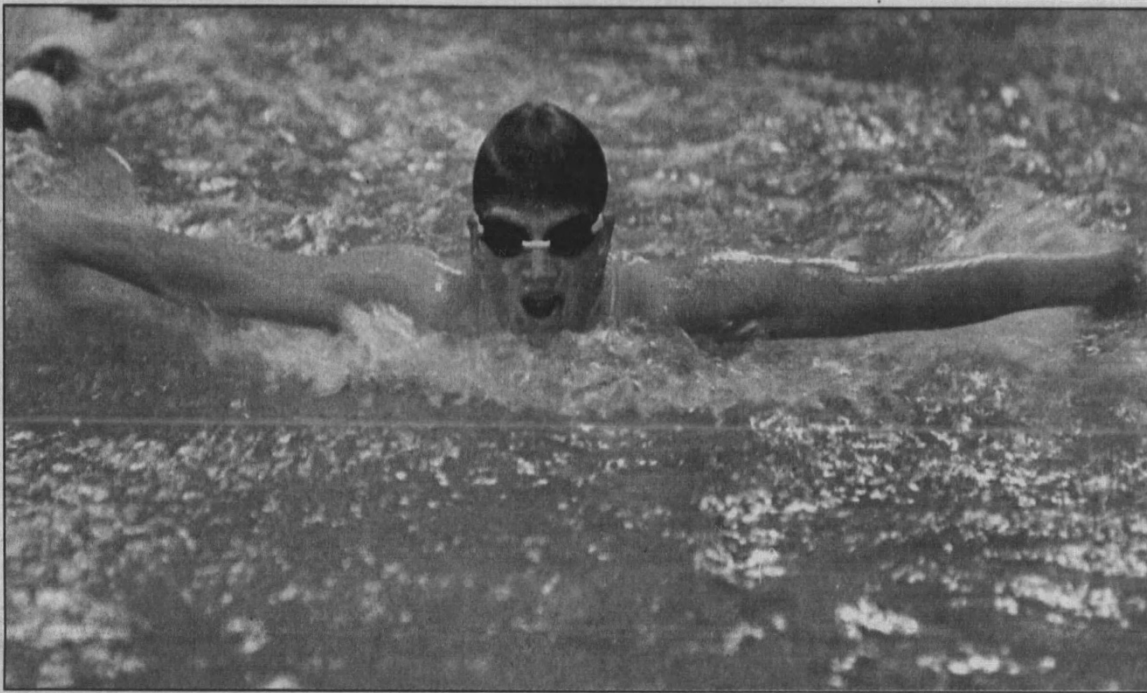

Ross off to a quick start

Moran pleased with Giants' effort in wins over Columbian

Both the boys and girls swimming teams at Fremont Ross started their seasons off on a positive note Wednesday, sweeping a dual meet with Tiffin Columbian at the Junior High pool. The boys won 73-21, with the girls posting a 66-28 margin of victory.

"We just basically wanted to see where we're at with our training, and we're pretty happy with where we're at," said Ross coach

Phil Moran. "They kind of surprised me, I didn't think they'd swim that fast."

Josh Fate made a spectacular debut for Ross, coming within a second of the school record in the 100 butterfly, winning in 55.75 seconds.

"He's basically been working hard since the end of his junior year," Moran said. "It's starting to pay off. All the kids have been hitting the weight room really hard."

Fate also combined with Buck Young, Dan Schrickel and Adam Bundschuh to win the 200 medley relay in 1:47.02 and J.J. Glaspy, Paul Nalley and Brandon Spicer to win the 400 freestyle relay in 3:54.47.

"That's a real good time for this time of year for the medley relay, it's about a second off the pool record," Moran said. "They had talked about it a little bit,

but I didn't think they were going to be this close."

Seth Geib picked up a win in the 200 IM (2:33.71), Noah Grayson won the 50 free (27.56), Bundschuh won the 100 free (56.86), Glaspy won the 500 free (5:42.69), Young won the 100 back (1:02.34), Schrickel won the 100 breast (1:07.24) and the team of Brent Tooman, Grayson, Glaspy and Eric Horn won the 200 free relay.

Collecting second place finishes were Brent Tooman

For the girls, Courtney Abbott got off to a blazing start in the 50 free, winning in 26.83.

"I think that's faster than her sectional time last year," Moran said. "She's really starting where she stopped last year, and that's hard to do for kids."

Abbott also combined with Britt O'Connor, Wendy Farrell and Morgan O'Connor to win the 200 medley relay and Meg Nalley, Sam Glaspy and Morgan O'Connor to win the 400 free relay.

Sarah Berger won the 100 free in 1:00.86.

"She had a real good meet, that's about a second and a half off her lifetime best," Moran said. "She should be breaking a minute pretty soon."

Katie Decker won the 200 free (2:13.88), Morgan O'Connor won the 200 IM (2:34.15), Britt O'Connor

won the 500 free (5:48.86), Noelle Stroempl won the 100 backstroke (1:14.07), Glaspy won the 100 breast (1:21.26) and the team of Nalley, Berger, Abby Cominsky and Erika Parker won the 200 free relay (1:56.65).

Taking second for the girls were Kristen Vandyne (200 free), Glaspy (200 IM), Beth Hoelzle (100 fly), Anna Obregon (100 back), Farrell (100 breast) and the 200 free relay team of Farrell, Brittney Werling, Kaylie Crispin and Ana Barros.

"Tonight we swam some of our younger kids," Moran said. "Tiffin's kind of a new program, so we did some other things. We swam really well, we probably could have swam better, but we're trying to get experience."

Seniors will determine Ross swimmers' 'Fate'

Fremont Ross swimming coach Phil Moran has a problem. An enviable problem, to be sure, but a problem nonetheless.

The dilemma? Where to put talented senior Josh Fate.

"He can swim any event for us, just about any stroke," Moran said. "Any place we put him, he should be in contention."

Fate will be counted on to step into a leadership role after the graduations of swimmers like Pryde Yost, Brett

Spicer, Jon Oliver and Josh Tooman. So Fate and fellow seniors Buck Young and J.J. Glaspy will be counted on even more.

"The rest of the kids look up to them for guidance," Moran said.

Moran said Young will swim primarily the 100 and 200 backstroke, and help out on relays. Glaspy swam on two freestyle relay teams in the Little Giants' season-opening meet with Tiffin Columbian on

Wednesday.

While Fate is a most versatile swimmer, Moran said the one stroke he doesn't own right now is the breaststroke. Junior Dan Schrickel is Moran's best in that stroke.

"Schrickel's going to step it up, he's swimming some fast splits on the breaststroke," Moran said. "He could be very scary come the end of the year."

Others looking to fill the void are Seth Geib and Adam Bundschuh. Youngsters like Noah Grayson, Elliot Hogan, Eric Horn, Paul Nalley,

Mervin Forbes, Brandon Spicer, Robbie Straight and upperclassmen Brent Tooman and Mark Thomson will also contribute.

Ross will go with three freshman divers, Neamit Patel, Joe Rapp and Brian

Whitright.

The girls team loses just as much to graduation as the boys team did, with Amy Barnes, Nicole Farrell and Jenny Schaaf off to college.

Senior Courtney Abbott will step into a leadership role, and

got off to a good start Wednesday in the 50 freestyle. Juniors Meg Nalley, Beth Hoelzle and Noelle Stroempl are other upperclassmen Moran is looking to for improvement.

The coach is also excited about his underclassmen.

"We have a young group of girls that is very talented," Moran said. "We have a lot of sophomores who are going to play key roles for us."

Morgan O'Connor, Sarah Berger and Kristen VanDyne are the sophomores Moran referred to, also mentioning freshman Brittany O'Connor.

Jenny Straight leads the divers, along with Rachael Rusch, Jera Johnson and Alyssa Zimmerman.

"They're showing a lot of potential, we have some numbers there," Moran said. "That should help us a lot in the dual meets. We've always been pretty strong with the divers we've had."

Moran said Straight would have been a state qualifier last season, had the Ohio High School Athletic Association split the state tournament into two divisions.

A two-division format will be in effect this year for the girls, a change Moran endorses.

"We're going to be able to advance a lot more kids," he said. "It'll make the kids work even harder, because that shot seems more realistic. That's something the girls team's looking at, they have the potential."

Conversely, though, the boys state tournament will remain a one-division affair.

"That's kind of a controversy, most coaches aren't happy with that," Moran said. "Division II schools are really going to be put at a disadvantage, it's really disappointing. Our boys state meet is so fast, even if we split, it's still going to be fast."

Moran points to a three-meet stretch in the middle of the season as a key for his teams: Dec. 21 at Perkins, at home Dec. 22 against Findlay and Jan. 8 at the Timken Relays in Canton.

"We got Perkins last year, the boys won by two, and they weren't real happy about losing," Moran said. "The girls won for the first time ever at Perkins. Perkins is a lot tougher this year."

"The Findlay girls are probably

in the top two in the district, they're real tough, so the girls will have their hands full."

Giants fare well at NWOAC

Divers break meet record

PORT CLINTON — It was a record-setting day for the Fremont Ross boys and girls swimming teams at the NWOAC relays Saturday.

The boys took second place behind Napoleon, the Little Giants' best finish ever. Coach Phil Moran's team also had three first-place finishes, the team's best since returning to the NWOAC in 1996.

"We swam a lot of our younger swimmers to give them some valuable experience for the rest of the season," Moran said.

Ross was dominant in the relays, winning the 300 breaststroke, the 400 freestyle and the 400 medley.

Buck Young, Dan Schrickel, Josh Fate and Adam Bundschuh teamed up to win the 400 medley in 3:57.50. The same foursome also won the 400 free in 3:34.98.

Seth Geib, Noah Grayson, Elliot Hogan and Schrickel swam a winning time of 3:26.35 to win the 300 breaststroke.

The diving combination of Brian Whitright and Neamit Patel took second with a 92.40. Individually, Fate took second in the 500 free in 5:16.51.

Other top-four finishes included the Ross 800 free relay (Young, Brent Tooman, Geib and J.J. Glaspy), the 300 IM (Glaspy, Geib and Bundschuh) and the 200 free relay (Grayson, Hogan, Rob Straight and Paul Nalley).

Divers Jenny Straight and Alyssa Zimmerman took

first place with a total of 202.20, setting a new meet record. The old record of 201.60 was set by Northview in 1988.

Also for the girls, the 400 medley relay team of Britany O'Connor, Wendy Farrell, Morgan O'Connor and Courtney Abbott took second in 4:40.22.

"The girls really did a nice job," Moran said.

The Ross girls took fourth place with 50 points — their best finish since returning to the NWOAC — and Oak Harbor took fifth with 48. Notre Dame won with 104 points.

Little Giants set personal bests

COLUMBUS — The Fremont Ross girls swim team turned in a number of personal bests Saturday at the Ned Reeb Memorial Invitational, held at Ohio State's Mike Peppe Aquatic Center.

In the 200 freestyle, Sarah Berger's time of 2:16.41 was a personal best, as was Meg Nalley's 2:15.40. Berger also set a PR in the 50 free (27.46), as did Brittany O'Connor, whose PR time of 25.87 in the preliminaries qualified her for the finals, where she finished 11th.

O'Connor also had a PR in the 100 free, where she swam a 58.08.

Morgan O'Connor set a lifetime best in the 100 butterfly, where she swam a 1:05.94. In the 100 backstroke, Kristen VanDyne swam a PR 1:14.94.

For the boys, the 200 medley relay team of Buck Young, Dan Schrickel, Josh Fate and Adam Bundschuh finished sixth in 1:46.98. The same foursome finished eighth in the 400 free relay in 3:34.14.

Fate had a solid day individually, finishing fifth in the 100 backstroke in 59.26 and eighth in the 100 fly in 56.43. Young finished ninth in the 100 backstroke in 1:00.16, and J.J. Glaspy set a new PR in the 200 free in 2:04.05.

"The kids did a lot of good things this weekend," said Ross coach Phil Moran. "Many of them had the best day in their lives. This meet will provide a lot of inspiration for the remainder of the season."

Ross swims against Oak Harbor and Port Clinton on Tuesday before traveling to Sylvania for a big meet Friday against Northview.

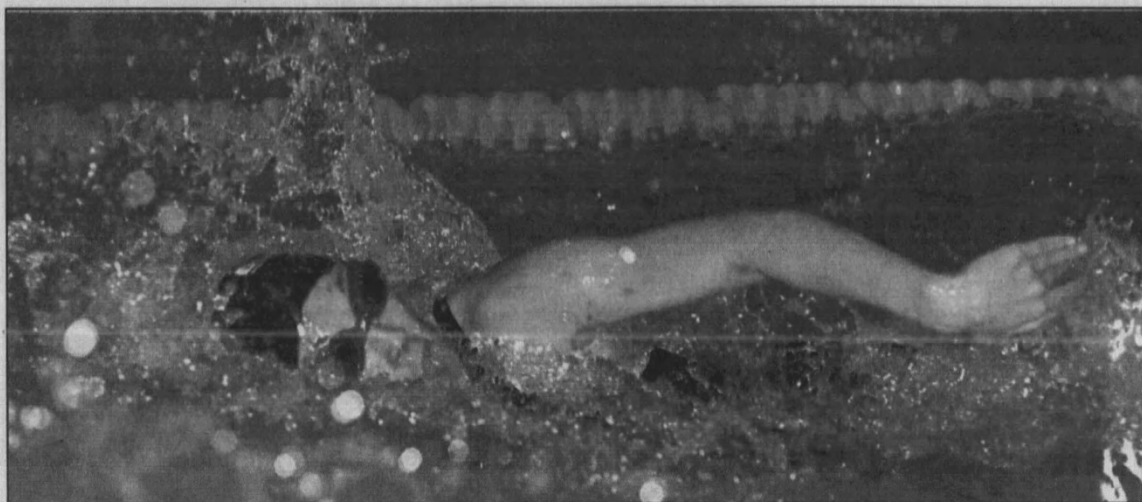

Little Giants win triangular with first, third in last event

PORT CLINTON — Fremont Ross had too much talent and too much depth for host Port Clinton and Oak Harbor during Tuesday's swimming and diving meet at Port Clinton High School.

The Little Giants' boys team scored 148 points to beat the Redskins by 55 points, while Oak Harbor was third with 83.

Ross also won the girls meet, with 146 points, followed by the Rockets (139) and Redskins (44).

"Ross has a nice boys team," PC coach Ken Gipe said. "They have decent

depth and several good individuals. I know Oak Harbor won quite a few girls events, but Ross had a little more depth.

"That was really a good meet. It came down to the last relay and Fremont went first and third to pull it out."

For the girls, Ross needed a clutch performance in the 400 freestyle relay to close out Oak Harbor. The team of Sarah Berger, Morgan O'Connor, Kristen VanDyne and Beth Hoelzle came through, taking first in 4:04.35.

Clinching things was the third place team of Meg

Nalley, Erika Parker, Noelle Stroempl and Sam Glaspy, which finished in 4:24.28.

It was the first time in Ross coach Phil Moran's six years at the school that Ross had won the triangular.

Ross dominated the diving competition, with Jenny Straight taking first, Alyssa Zimmerman second and Rachael Rusch third. Brittany O'Connor won the 100 backstroke in 1:08.74.

While the Rockets girls won nine events, compared to three for Ross, it was the Little Giants' depth that prevailed.

Berger (200 free), Courtney Abbott (50 free, 100 free), O'Connor (500 free), Morgan O'Connor (100 fly), Stroempl (100 back) and Wendy Farrell (100 breast) had second place finishes, as did the relay teams of the O'Connors, Abbott and Glaspy (200 medley relay) and the O'Connors, Berger and Abbott (200 free relay).

The boys competition wasn't as close. A highlight for the Little Giants was the 400 free relay, where Ross placed three teams under the four-minute barrier for the first time ever.

Dan Schrickel, Adam Bundschuh, Brent Tooman

and Eric Horn won the event in 3:56.36, Buck Young, J.J. Glaspy, Seth Geib and Noah Grayson were third in 3:58.05 and Josh Fate, Elliot Hogan, Paul Nalley and Rob Straight were fourth in 3:59.56.

Individually, Young won the 200 free and 500 free, Fate won the 100 back and Hogan won the 100 breast.

Glaspy (200 free, 100 fly) and Schrickel (500 free) took second place, as did the relay teams of Tooman, Geib, Bundschuh and Horn (200 medley) and Fate, Grayson, Straight and Nalley (200 free).

The 200-free relay team of Brittany O'Connor, Sarah Berger, Morgan O'Connor and Courtney Abbott swam to a first place finish in 1:49.65 and also finished first in 4:05.29 in the 400 free relay.

"The girls didn't run away with (the meet), which is fine, but I think they could have," Moran said. "The girls swam better than they have all year."

Taking second and third place honors in the 200 IM were Meg Nalley (2:36.72)

and Sam Glaspy (2:36.84), respectively, which Moran said were lifetime bests for them.

Moran also complimented Noelle Stroempl's second place finish in the 100 back.

"Today she swam a 1:10, and she went 1:13 yesterday," Moran said.

The Little Giants return to action Jan. 8 at the Timken Relays in Canton.

"We usually swim well there," said Moran. "It's the state facility and that's the goal for our kids. They want to go down there and try to do their best at the state pool and get some experience there."

The rest of the GLL is really down depth-wise, they just can't compete, they don't have the numbers. Findlay's got some great boys, but they just don't have the numbers."

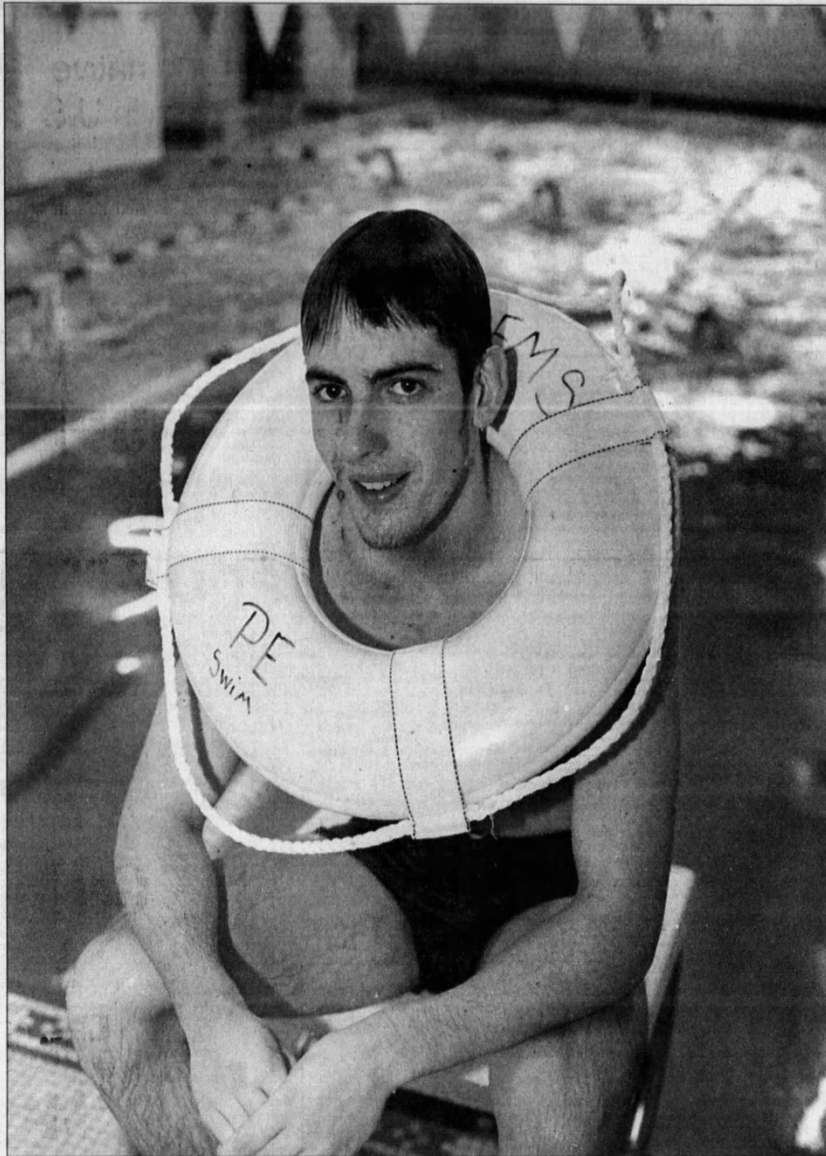

Senior stands out for Ross boys

The coach saw it right away.

Art Bucci, now the athletic director at Fremont Ross, was the school's swimming coach for much of the 1980s, and also taught swimming lessons on the side at the Fremont Yacht Club.

One day, Donna Fate,

who was a swimmer on Bucci's boys teams in the 1970s, brought her oldest child, Josh, to the club for lessons.

"He was a good one," says Bucci.

"He's a natural in the water, he was not afraid. He loved the water, and he caught on very quickly."

It was a natural match.

"It was always a lot of fun," says Fate, The News-Messenger Athlete of the Week.

Fremont swim fans and coaches have had a lot of fun watching Fate ever since.

The Ross senior marked yet another high

point in his already successful season Saturday in Napoleon, setting three meet records at the Wildcat Classic.

Fate set individual meet records in the 100 fly (56.89) and 200 IM (2:07.6), and teamed up with Adam Bundschuh, Dan Shrickel and Buck Young to set a record in the 200 medley relay (1:46.71).

Yet while Fate and swimming have long seemed a perfect match, his ascension into the ranks of the region's elite swimmers was not a forgone conclusion, Ross swim coach Phil Moran says. Moran says he met Fate when the latter was as a junior high swimmer, and the seventh grader was far from a finished product.

"He really wasn't that good a swimmer," Moran said. "He really wasn't that strong on most of the strokes. He was an OK swimmer. I don't think he really trained a whole lot.

"He was small, his nickname was 'Sticks.' It really doesn't apply as much now, but we still call him that."

As a youngster, Fate was sort of a swimming anomaly: his weakest stroke was the freestyle, Moran says.

"That usually tends to be their strong stroke, because

it's the easiest one," Moran says. "He'd do real well, but then lose on the freestyle leg."

But Fate has turned that weakness into a strength. While his best strokes are probably the butterfly and backstroke, his freestyle has improved to the point where he is dangerous in the IM.

"He's just progressed," Moran says. "He was used to being in the first heat in the outside lanes at these meets; now he finds himself in the final heat. It's nice to see a kid progress that much.

"He showed a lot of desire, asked questions, listened well. Give me a kid like that, they're going to improve, and in the end, that's the deciding factor. A coach can only do so much, the kid has to take that step."

A big step for Fate came when he was a sophomore in the 1997-98 season. That year, he broke a decade-old school record in the 100 backstroke, swimming a 55.8.

But that isn't the only school record Fate has his name on. Fate teamed with Pryde Yost, Brett Spicer and Dan Schrickel to set a school record of 1:29.27 in the 200 free relay.

The team picked the perfect event to swim the record-setting time: last year's state championships in Canton. Though the team missed qual-

ifying for the finals by .04 seconds, the trip was a valuable learning experience.

"We went Thursday, and it was really exciting," Fate says. "Everything's real competitive, everybody's doing all their traditional stuff, going to eat at the same places, everything has to be perfect."

For Fate and the gang, which included Young as an alternate, that meant meals at the Olive Garden and T.G.I. Fridays.

"We went the same places Molly O'Connor had gone when she had gone down," Fate says.

The current 200 IM team has a solid shot at returning to Canton. With Young on backstroke, Schrickel on breaststroke, Fate on butterfly and Bundschuh on freestyle, the team has the potential.

Moran says the foursome's chemistry has been outstanding.

"They spend so much time together in school and summertime," he says. "You better hope you like each other, because you're around each other so much and do a lot of stuff together."

The same could be said for the entire Ross team, not just the relay units. Fate and Young serve as co-captains for the boys team, forcing them

into leadership roles.

"We just try to keep everybody's mind where it needs to be, make them concentrate on swimming and on what they need to be doing," Fate says. "We're getting better. The younger kids didn't know what was going on at first, but they're realizing we need everybody to win."

The result has been some of the best overall team cohesiveness Moran has seen in his 13 years in the program.

"This is probably the best chemistry we've ever had between the boys and girls teams," Moran says. "We really haven't had any in-fighting. Josh and Buck are doing really well as captains. Josh isn't necessarily as vocal, but a lot of it is leading by example. Our captains don't have too many responsibilities, but we expect them to lead by example."

That applies to the classroom as well. Moran says Fate is a 3.0 student, and was a solid performer in the coach's ninth grade history class.

After high school, Fate hopes to swim collegiately, and says he has talked with Findlay and Eastern Michigan about possibilities there. He plans on studying somewhere in the fields of engineering or graphic design.
