Rhodes rules as one of the favorites in the shot put with a winning toss of 55-4 in the Sandusky District. Thursday in dual meet competition the 6-2, 255-pound senior upped his Ross school record to 55-10. For the better part of the season Rhodes struggled to break a Ross record of 54-0.

Linder has proved consistency once this was broken his district will be district winners from Sandusky, Bowling Green, Mansfield, Toledo, Elyria and Rhodes. The Class A regional includes district qualifiers from Tiffin, Montpelier, Mansfield and Findlay.

In the Class A competition the class appears to come from Mansfield and Findlay districts. Mansfield recorded six top times and Findlay seven in the district result comparisons.

In some cases the schools will be represented by less boys than the number of entries, since one person could have qualified in more than one event. Also, the presence of a relay qualifier, such as two by Port Clinton and Danbury, one by Clyde, would involve more than one boy in an entry.

Rhodes' 55-10 is a shade behind the best shot put of the districts, a 57-4 at Elyria by Westlake's Parker Reynolds.

## Woodmore's Fegley, Durdel, Koepke Gain State Track

Is it possible for a first-year school to win a state championship? Woodmore high school has three boys going to the state track meet who hope they can supply an affirmative answer to that question. The Wildcats, a first-year consolidation of old Woodmore and Elmore high schools, qualified only three boys for the state tournament, but these three will participate in five events.

The magical trio accounted for three first places and two seconds in the regional tournament Saturday at Bowling Green University. Dave Fegley was the class of the hurdles, winning both timber-topping events and accomplishing a

personal goal in the process. Rex Durdel was second in the shot put despite his best toss of the season, and first in the discus, although throwing approximately eight feet less than his best of the season.

Adding a second place in the pole vault was Galen Koepke. The personal goal for Fegley was a 15-second flat time in the 180-yard high hurdles. He wanted to better the :15.1 by his coach, James Smithey, when he was a high school runner. Fegley had a :21.3 clocking in the 180-yard low hurdles. Durdel's winning discus was 147-7 and with a shot put of 51-5  $\frac{1}{2}$  was second to the 53-1 $\frac{1}{4}$  by Mont-

pelier's Dave Dreher. Koepke's 11-2 vault was second behind the 11-4 by Lincolnview's Greg Davis.

The only other area entry to win a trip to Class A state was the Lakeside Danbury 880-yard relay team of Joe Boss, Mike Turninsky, Dave Wahlers and Mike Tracy. This quartet was fourth in the event with a 1:35.5.

In Class AA, Jeff Linta of Mansfield Malabar

Freight Roy, Dave Rhodes was the only area competitor to earn a ticket to Columbus. Rhodes put the shot 54-4 $\frac{1}{2}$  to finish third in the regional. Ahead of Rhodes were Parker Reynolds, Westlake, 55-1 $\frac{1}{2}$ ; and Greg Huth, Parma, 54-4 $\frac{1}{2}$ .

In the regionals the top four performers in each event qualified for the state meet.

Other area competitors were victims of the fact times better than their best of the season were needed to win.

Top performers faced with this dilemma included Rex Brockschmidt, two-miler; and John Gladieux, 880-yard and 1600-yard runs. Linton's Larry Burroughs, Clyde, and Harold Straubbaugh, Oak Harbor, both quartermilers. Ross's Dan Linder could not top 13 ft. in the height needed for fourth place behind Jeff Linta's 144, winning height in the pole vault. Linta is of Mansfield Malabar.
