Jim Tiller Sets Broad Jump Mark

Members of Ross high's track team earned places in the Class A district meet at Bowling Green State university Friday, coming through their heats for final berths, but Little Giant tennis players and the golf squad dropped from further contention.

Jim Tiller, fleet junior in the Purple and White ranks, cracked a board jump record that stands in district competition, when he leaped 22 feet, eight inches to qualify for today's finals.

Coach Mal Mackey said that in one of Tiller's earlier leaps, he had fouled at the jump line, and the leap not credited.

Gail Brauchla, who enters his specialty, the high jump today, came in second to Tiller Friday with a 20'9" leap. The one-two combination in district meets was also something new around the field in Bowling Green.

In the 100 yard dash, Tiller qualified with a 10.3 showing to take first in his heat, and also qualified in the 220 yard dash. He will be back today for the finals in both dashes, along with the broad jump.
