### Little Giants Meet Clay In Lidlifter

Weather permitting, the Ross high school baseball team is slated to open its 1970 baseball season Saturday with a doubleheader at Oregon Clay.

If the Little Giants are able to open the campaign, there will be plenty of new faces around, including that of a new head coach. Tom Dorman will be starting his first year as pilot of the Ross ship.

And, only three lettermen return from last year's team that compiled an 11-7 record under the departed Don Purvis. The returnees include seniors Kirk Held and Rusty Zimmerman and junior Randy Arndt.

Held, who also lettered as a sophomore, will draw the starting pitching assignment against Clay. He has a 10-2 career record. Because he's the only experienced pitcher, Dorman expects Held to carry the brunt of the pitching load until the middle of the season.

Zimmerman will probably be the starting first baseman. He caught and played outfield last season. Arndt will be the third baseman.

Dorman has indicated he wants to start Gary Butdorf as Held's battery mate. If Butdorf doesn't go behind the dish, Zimmerman will don the 'tools of ignorance'

Denny Smith will get the starting assignment at first base if Zimmerman is switched to catching. The second baseman in the first game should be Tom Brough and Paul Miller will handle the shortstop duties.

In the outfield, Dorman can call on Mark Sanderson, Chuck Lindsey, Al Davis, Scott Johnson and Manfred Straube.

Dorman hopes to have Held share the opening-game pitching duties with junior Denny Shearon. The starting hurler in the second game of the twin bill will probably be Ron Boucher. Brough is slated to provide relief.

When Brough is pitching, his infield position will be taken by Lindsey, a sophomore.

"This is a real good group of boys to work with," Dorman says. "Anything we accomplish this year will be done by the team. We don't have any one or two boys who are going to stand out.

"We're hoping our pitching staff will come along as the year progresses. Right now we will need to rely on our defense—appears to be our big strong point right now.

"I don't think we are going to be a great hitting team. We'll probably do a lot of running during the season. Our big problem is overall experience. We just don't have that many fellows, who have played in a varsity ball game. I'm hoping our hustle, desire and conditioning make up for it."

Dorman, who's an assistant football coach at Ross, will be assisted by Henry Miesle. Miesle will also pilot the reserve team. The reserves are slated to play a five game schedule this season. This season marks the first time Ross has ever had a reserve schedule.
