The fifth place finish in the Conference meet concluded a season of eight wins, two losses for Ross. The Little Giants lost their first meet to Lakota and last to Sandusky with eight victories sandwiched in between. Ross then finished second in the district to qualify for the regional, where they ran ninth.
