

Little Giants make most of opportunities in 5-1 win

MAUMEE — Fremont Ross doesn't get many scoring chances. When the Little Giants do, they take advantage.

Ross had five shots on goal in the first half of a Division I sectional tournament match Thursday against Toledo Bowsher, but Neil Sachs put two of in the net and the Little Giants went on to a 5-1 win.

By controlling midfield at the Lucas County Recreation Center, Ross was never threatened and won for the 12th time in 17 matches.

"That has been our philosophy all year," Ross coach Jon Detwiler said.

"We try to have the ball most of the time."

Sachs finished with a hat trick, adding an unassisted goal in the first minute of the second half.

"We were communicating and I was in scoring position," Sachs said. "The passing sets it all up."

Bowsher coach Dan Contreras concurred.

"Up to now, defense has been a strong point," he said. "We work hard on defending wall passing. My defender said they were too good for him."

MAUMEE — Perrysburg recorded 21 shots on goal to just five for Fremont Ross Saturday in a 5-0 victory over the Little Giants in the section round of the Division I district soccer tournament at the Lucas County Rec Center.

Ross ended the season 12-6.

"It was ugly. We were definitely outplayed," Ross coach John Detwiler said.
